The special committee appointed to look after the Canning Factory contract made the following report, which upon motion was accepted and ordered placed on file.

To the Mayor and Common Council of the city of Owosso:

Gentlemen:—Your committee appointed by your resolution and contract, dated April 7th, 1888, between the city and Messrs. Wiggins & Burdett, of the Owosso Canning and Preserving Co., beg leave to report that they have had the same under consideration; and that in the opinion of your committee said Canning and Preserving Co. have complied with the conditions as far as relative to the construction of buildings, and commencing and pursuing the business specified, a copy of which is herewith attached.

In regard to the further fulfillment of said contract in the future, your committee, in case you desire it to pursue it further, would ask instructions as regards security. In case the business is abandoned or not conducted or carried on in accordance with the spirit of this contract, that the money shall be returned to the city. Whether the Council will require any further security or bond for the faithful performance of the future of the contract, or whether they are satisfied to deliver the order without further security. We would ask full instructions as to your wishes.

On motion of Ald. Frieske the Clerk was instructed to draw an order for \$500 to fulfill provisions contained in contract passed by the Common Council of the city of Owosso, April 7, 1888. Carried. Ayes 7, nays 0.

The committee on streets and sidewalks made the following report, which upon motion was accepted and adopted. Ayes 7, nays 0.

Your committee on streets and alleys beg leave to report that the grading of Stewart street, from Shiawassee street to Cedar street is now completed and accepted by the committee, and recommended that an order for the sum of sixty dollars be drawn in favor of Thomas Simington, in payment for the same.

The committee on Finance reported favorably on the above accounts as presented, the report was accepted, unanimous consent was given and the accounts allowed. Ayes 7, nays 0.

Ald. Frieske presented the following resolution which upon motion was accepted, ayes 7, nays 0.

Resolved, By the Common Council of the city of Owosso.

That, Common Council will meet in the Common Council Room, on Monday, Sept. 17th, 1888, at 8 o'clock p. m. for the purpose of reviewing, correcting or confirming the grade rolls of Grover street and Jerome Avenue.

The grade rolls of Jerome Avenue and Grover street were taken up and on motion of Ald. Frieske the same was ordered printed.

Ald. Frieske presented an ordinance to provide for the construction of a sidewalk on the east side of Elmwood street, from the north line of King street, to the south line of lot owned by P. S. Crawford in the city of Owosso.

The ordinance was read the first and second times by its title, unanimous consent was given, the ordinance ordered read in full and placed upon its passage and passed. Ayes 7, nays 0.

Ald. Kilpatrick offered the following resolution which upon motion was laid on the table for one week.

Whereas, Julius and Herman Frieske have been digging up, and carrying away portions of Stewart street, in the city of Owosso, to the depth of from four to five feet in places to the great injury to said street and the city of Owosso, and that to continue such excavations and thereby making the grading of said street more expensive by several hundred dollars than it otherwise would have been.

Now therefore be it resolved by the Common Council, of the city of Owosso, that the City Attorney be, and is hereby directed to take such legal steps and institute such legal proceedings as will protect the said street and said city by reason of such injury and threatened injury to said street.

On motion of Ald. Kilpatrick the committee on streets and sidewalks were instructed to make whatever arrangements necessary for the filling up space at race bridge on Main street. Carried, ayes 7, nays 0.

Council then adjourned.

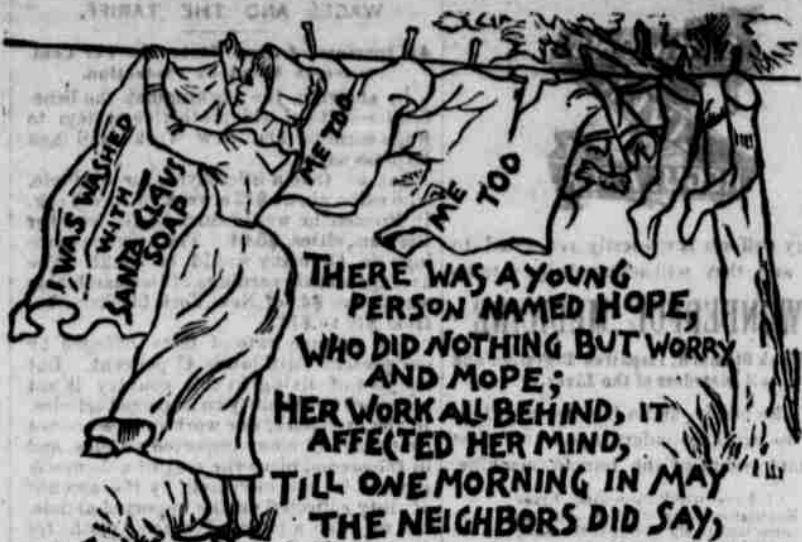
