The "horse for all work" is intended to be capable of being trained for the saddle, and for the harness, and be able to go on the road or in draft, as he may chance to be broken. It may be that the "horse for all work" shall after a few years training, make a useful, spirited, handsome family roadster, or he may be brought up to be a good draft horse, true to pull any load that is put behind him. Hence the committee will note that he is not to be judged by the speed he may make for a single mile. It will also be noted that he must have size, action and spirit, as well as constitution, if he is worthy of a premium as a breeding animal.  
All horses shown in harness must be exhibited on the track. See note class 1.
