Medical Examiner For Local Post

Lewis of the War Risk Section of the United States public health service, while in Ashland recently appointed Dr. Gordon MacCracken, an ex-service man, medical examiner for this territory. This work will be carried on by the American Legion in connection with the public health service, and each man who had served the government during the late war will be given an opportunity to be examined in case any physical troubles arise attributable to causes contracted during the war.
