WHAT STOCKS SHOW BIG INCREASE FOR THE WEEK

PORTLAND, Sept. 1.—The U. S. Grain Corporation has just issued a bulletin showing the wheat receipts from farms for the week ending August 15 to be 42,349,000 bushels, as against 30,693,000 bushels for the same week a year ago. Wheat receipts from farms June 27 to August 15, 245,726,000 bushels, against 213,751,000 bushels for same period previous year.

Total stocks of wheat, all elevators and mills, 164,271,000 bushels, against 125,292,000 bushels for same week a year ago.

Change for week, 23,998,000 bushels increase, while one year ago it was but 15,577,000 bushels.


