NO BACKWARD STEP.

A petition for an ordinance permitting the riding of bicycles on the sidewalks of Dallas is being circulated and will be presented to the city council in the near future. For the credit of Dallas as an up-to-date and progressive town, it is to be hoped that this petition will not be granted by the council. The repeal of the existing ordinance would be a decidedly backward step—one that would benefit only a few people and inconvenience many.

Dallas took the lead in abolishing the bicycle nuisance many years ago, and nearly every town of importance in Oregon has since followed her example. Salem is about the only town where the custom is still permitted and right at this time the citizens of the Capitol, backed by the daily papers, are making a determined effort to put the bicycles in the street, where they belong. Only a few days ago, the Statesman printed an editorial severely condemning the practice of riding wheels on the sidewalks and characterizing Salem as the "mosh-back town of Oregon" for permitting the nuisance to exist.

The privilege of riding wheels on the sidewalks would doubtless be appreciated by a few business men. It would also be hailed with delight by a gang of young hoodlums, who, caring nothing for the rights or safety of pedestrians, would quickly seize the opportunity to make the sidewalks a race-course. The business men would ride carefully and would endeavor to respect the special privileges given them. The idle boys and girls would race up and down the walks, jangling their bells in the ears of civil pedestrians and making themselves a nuisance generally. This was the state of affairs before the existing ordinance was passed, and there is no reason to believe that it would be otherwise if the law should be repealed.

If an effective ordinance could be passed limiting the privilege to business men only, there would probably be no objection from any quarter, notwithstanding the fact that a bicycle is a vehicle, and as such, belongs in the street. But an ordinance permitting certain persons to ride and forbidding others the same right would come under the head of class legislation and would not be worth the paper on which it was written. An attempt to solve this problem by limiting the speed and restricting the privileges of the riders would prove ineffective, as a dozen special policemen would be required in enforcing the law. Even then, the people in the outlying residence districts, where the nuisance is always the greatest, would be without protection.

The Observer believes that the present law is a good law. It believes that it voices the sentiment of a large majority of the men and women of Dallas when it expresses the hope that this law will not be changed. As far as the petition is concerned, it is more than probable that the greater number of signers are men who care little about the matter one way or the other. Petitions are easily obtained nowadays; one can get a petition for almost anything. The present councilmen are nearly, if not all, experienced officers, and they know the utter worthlessness of a petition as an expression of the real desires of the people. How many times these councilmen have had some one take them around the corner and whisper: "I signed Jones' petition yesterday, but I hope the council will not grant it. You see, Jones, is a good friend and customer of mine, and I didn't like to offend him, so I put down my name." This is the way signatures to a petition are secured—not all signatures, but many—and it shows of how little worth a petition is nowadays.

The first bicycle ordinance in Dallas was passed in the face of a large remonstrance, and inside of six months many of the business men who had been riding wheels expressed their hearty approval of the law and the hope that it would be retained on the city statute books. One day a councilman saw a reckless young wheelman run against a baby carriage in front of the Chapman furniture store and throw the tiny occupant headlong to the sidewalk. A few days later, an old gray-haired mother was crowded off the walk near the Hotel Orial to make room for two

"snazy" boys to pass. At the next council meeting, the present bicycle ordinance was introduced. It is safe to say that no member of that board has ever had cause to regret voting for it.

Court street is rapidly becoming one of the principal business thoroughfares of Dallas. The Observer predicts that at least two modern brick buildings will be built on that street next spring.

Dallas is growing more rapidly than at any time in her past history. With all this growth and development, it seems a pity that her principal industries—the sawmills—should be compelled to close down on account of a lack of cars to move their product.
