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DEATHS INCREASE FROM BABY SCOURGE

New York, July 14.—The infantile paralysis epidemic took another serious turn today. The health authorities who yesterday believed the plague was being checked, announced a sharp increase in the number of new cases and in the number of deaths in the past 24 hours.

Since yesterday morning 162 new cases have been discovered, as compared with 117 in the previous 24 hours. The deaths reported this morning total 31, as against 24 for the previous day.
