DAIRY MANUFACTURE STUDIED

Classes in dairy manufacture at O. A. C. this winter will be divided into the experienced and inexperienced students. Men who have engaged actively in the dairy factory work—making butter, cheese, ice cream, etc.—will be given advanced work on lines of their own choosing. Men who are preparing to enter dairy factory work for the first time will be

given the more fundamental work essential to their needs. The course begins January 3 and runs for eight weeks.

CHILDREN GET MORE MILK

Just 293 children of Medford and Grants Pass are now getting milk, who did not get any when the more milk campaign opened in these Oregon towns. Of these 192 live in Med-

ford and 191 in Grants Pass. In addition to these now enjoying milk for the first time 224 children of Grants Pass are getting more milk as one result of the campaign. The local supply of milk proved inadequate, and additional amounts had to be imported to meet the demand for milk for children. At Medford a special milk shop was established as one result of the campaign, which was in charge of the home demonstration

agents.

DAIRY PRIZES MANY

The six highest scoring butter exhibits entered for the Oregon Butter and Cheese Makers convention at Portland, December 9 and 10, will receive \$50, pro rata. The highest scoring cube will get the association gold medal, three barrels of Leslie salt, name engraved on the association silver cup, and the gold watch offered by J. B. Ford company. Second highest takes the association silver cup and three specials. The third highest gets the association bronze cup and a special. The highest cheese

score gets the association gold medal and three specials, including a \$20 piece by the J. B. Ford company. The second and third highest get the silver and the bronze cups and some specials. Exhibits are to be sent Prof. V. D. Chappell, care Portland Hotel.

AS TO POOR MOTHERS IN OUR COMMUNITY

When Judge Henry Nell, father of mothers' pensions, pushed his first pension bill through the Illinois Legislature in 1911, no state or nation in the world was paying poor mothers a cent for the highly important government work they were doing of bringing up their children properly, so that in a few years they would be good citizens.

This year—1920—Cook-co Illinois will pay half a million dollars in pensions, on order of court, to mothers of little ones whose fathers are dead, incapacitated, or missing.

The other day, the police of Chicago, which is in Cook-co, found two little boys wandering the streets at midnight, probably learning city deviltry. Taking them home about 2 a. m., the widowed mother was found. She had returned at midnight from her work of scrubbing in a big office building and at 2 a. m.

was starting her own washing her family of five children. court—Judge Arnold—gave pension at once; he decided that responsibility and public importance of rearing a family of five without having to earn a living them also.

Our rural towns and communities probably have few such cases as the foregoing. Yet, we have occasional poor widows, small children and poor mothers with bad husbands. Are we paying enough attention to the few have? Are we seeing to it that are able to bring their children properly including good nourishment and sufficient education to make them physically strong and mental strong American citizens?
