WYOMING ELK HUNT

and made three that we discovered. There may have been many more that we did not see and this proves the inefficiency of the Wyoming game laws. The deputy state game wardens have been weighed in the balance and found wanting. I do not believe that in every hundred violations there is one prosecution. It appears that there is only one way to save this last remaining herd of big game and that is federal control. The government should take charge and patrol all the Jackson Hole country with military police and that would make it as hard to violate the game laws and get away with it as it is to rob a postoffice. This will go far toward saving the elk that are fast disappearing under present conditions.

The next day, October 7, we packed and started the ponies toward home. The trails were still slippery but we got along without accident until over the mountain. Down on the river we came to a beaver dam that had to be crossed and the water was about three feet deep. The horses got through in good shape but when the burro reached the deepest place he laid down, evidently with the intention of committing suicide by drowning. The guides roped him, pulled him out and gave him a good beating. However, there was nothing lost but Vail's temper which he soon partially regained. The next day we fished down the river and took pictures, arriving at the Vail ranch about four o'clock. We brought out 600 pounds of jerked meat and the hides and horns weighed 400 pounds. We were now very eager to get to Idaho Falls, a distance of 75 miles, and the next day we at last succeeded in hiring a lady to take us in a Ford after making arrangements with Leon to send the meat, hides and heads at the first opportunity. This he did and they arrived in Condon in due time. This is the story of our elk hunt and I hope some readers have got a little pleasure out of reading about a trip which gave Clyde and I a great deal.
