City Council Proceedings.

CITY COUNCIL CHAMBER, (HOT SPRINGS, JUNE 7, 1892.)

Regular meeting. Present, the Mayor and councilmen Turner, Connor, Vincent, Marty and Jennings. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Committee on the publication of ordinances in pamphlet form were given further time to report.

Petition of F. T. Evans, et al. for the appointment of Frank R. Dornan as night police was presented and read.

The Mayor appointed the following as a committee on fire and police. Chairman Marty; Connor and Vincent.

There having been some complaints presented concerning members of the police force, the matter was referred by the Mayor to the committee on fire and police.

An ordinance to permit the running all large of dogs was presented and read, and passed its first reading by a unanimous vote.

An ordinance to repeal an ordinance granting certain rights to G. A. Eastman, et al. passed second reading all voting aye but Jennings, voting no.

The petition of W. I. Colvert asking for permit to erect a frame addition to his frame building was read and referred to committee on fire and police.

Petition of Ed. Phernetton for permission to lay a drain pipe from his well on Elkhorn street to the river was read and upon motion he was given permission to lay a pipe on Elkhorn street to the river, underground, on the sidewalk line, under the direction of the city engineer.

Upon motion the salaries of city officers for the month of May, were allowed and warrants ordered drawn.

The manner of dealing with the so called trusts or combinations that have of late sprung up in this country, has for some time engaged the serious attention of some of the ablest men in the country. How far government has the right to go in dealing with private enterprises is a very delicate question to decide, but unless these gigantic combinations show a disposition to deal fairly and to be content with smaller profits, public welfare demands that a limit be set to their extortions. In order to bring about any good without at the same time doing much harm the utmost discretion must be employed. Capital is not a bad thing and all capitalists are not necessarily bad men, as some calamity crakers seem to assume. But that vast combinations of capital are capable of exerting considerable oppression, does no longer admit of doubt. But in attempting the regulation of, or setting bounds to these trusts, legislation should not be shaped either by the tools of corporations or by those who are continually harping upon the downtrodden position of the laborer. The best interests of the country demand that these two important elements of production should be so nearly harmonized that what benefits the one, should benefit the other. Such a state of affairs can be promoted by wise and conservative action, while the gulf already existing would be only increased by the passage of too radical measures.

A bulletin of the "Course of Study and Methods of Instruction in the Preparatory Department of the State University" has been prepared by the authorities and is to be distributed to the teachers of the state and those interested in the work of the University. Our educators have already moved in the direction of securing greater unity in the educational work of the state, and this bulletin is prepared with the purpose of putting before the teachers and officers of the public schools, especially those of the towns, such information regarding the preparatory department of the University as will enable them, so far as may be practicable and desirable, to adjust their course of study and adapt their methods to those of this institution. Some of the high schools of the state are now accredited fitting schools for the University, and pupils from them enter it without examination upon presentation of proper certificates. The bulletin just issued looks toward further unity in this direction. The entire preparatory course of study is given, together with complete and definite statements of requirements, also what seems quite important, an outline of the methods of instruction employed. The general information contained in reference to the University, the calendar for next year, tuition, etc., make this bulletin of value to prospective students.
