A TYPICAL AMERICAN.

Whitelaw Reid is described as a typical American by Chauncey M. Depew. Mr. Reid's career entitles him to this distinction. Starting out a poor boy at Xenia, Ohio, he educated himself, taught school, edited a small country paper, went to the war as a correspondent, won distinction as one of the best war correspondents of the Union army, became editor of the New York Tribune and then its proprietor, and distinguished himself as an American diplomat who could say what he meant and mean what he said to the people who once had a very different definition for diplomacy. Mr. Reid has not only been thoroughly American himself, but he has spread American ideas in his letters from the battle-field, in his editorial utterances in a great newspaper, and as a United States Minister. No man better deserves the name "Typical American" than the republican candidate for Vice-President.—Inter Ocean.
