

Our Contribution to the Exhibit Fund.  
With the exception of a few hundred dollars which is assured within the week, the Black Hills quota (\$5,000) to the South Dakota exhibit fund has been raised, and Messrs. Star, Gardner and Evans, the special commissioners appointed to collect the amount, wish to extend their thanks for the generous support afforded them by the citizens of every town in the Black Hills. The commissioners, who spent their time and money in the work, are to be commended for the bulldog-like tenacity with which they stuck to their tasks. At the outset the commissioners were badly handicapped by the lack of interest people took in the scheme, and although in a measure discouraged, kept at it with success. The following amounts have already been collected: Deadwood, \$1,200; Lead, \$1,000; Rapid, \$1,000; Spearfish, \$500; Sturgis, \$600, making a total of \$4,300. Hot Springs, Custer, Hill City and other towns making up the balance of the \$5,000.—Deadwood Times.

A Wonderful Mine.

The J R mine is surprising everybody. Its ore turns out to be even richer than its most sanguine owners had an idea of. The discovery is an old one, and it is a strange incident indeed that of all the rich prospects found in the early days in this part of the Hills this one should have been abandoned as valueless, and so much money should have been expended for development on the King Solomon, Bengal Tiger and Golden Summit claims, all of which have proved a failure so far. The J R location was made by A. A. Kresse and H. C. Pettit in January last, on which they found an old shaft, and in sinking the same deeper found the ledge to prospect well in gold. Jacob Lampert, of Rapid, was visiting with Kresse at the time, secured an interest in the property by offering to put up a ten stamp mill. The bargain was accepted, the mill was erected and the crushing of ore begun. The first six days run with five stamps resulted in a clean-up of 83 ozs. 8 pwt. and 3 grs., but the last weeks run with ten stamps left the first far behind. The retort brought up last Monday was 203 ozs. 4 pwt. and 12 grs., about \$3,500. There is enough ore in sight right now to repeat such clean-ups many times over. Miners who are idle might follow the example set by Kresse and Pettit and prospect old shafts and for all they know might be as lucky and strike another bonanza which will make them rich in a short while.—Hill City News.

Hot Springs is literally thronged with people in search of health and pleasure.


The main attraction is the "plunge." It is a tank filled with water that gurgles up from a series of warm springs, thus purifying and changing the water every hour. It is from three to eight feet deep and is as warm as fresh milk. A toboggan slide, a trapeze, ropes and rafts provide a variety of amusements that lends to the plunge an attraction not equaled by any other place of pleasure in the Hills. At night in the glow of the electric lights the scene is entrancing. The water changes in color from a sea green to a cerulean blue. The arms and faces of the bathers look like marble. At the bottom the pebbles glisten like rich stones. As the ladies dive to the bottom for one of these listening things, or strike out boldly through the clear water, they remind the looker-on of mermaids or sirens, while the gentlemen, in their striped bathing suits, appear very much like huge frogs in an aquarium.

Another place around which centers a marked interest is the park. It winds in and about the sides of a huge hill opposite the Minnekahta block. Cedars and pines grow out from pebbly walks or stand erect and imposing on the cliffs overhanging the rippling waters of the river. Here visitors can muse and read in true poetic style "beneath the sylvan shade close by a babbling brook." To sit in one of the rustic seats at sunset, breathe the fresh mountain air, listen to the waters and look out upon the landscape and the glint of the yellow sunset, would awaken even in the most stoic mind an appreciation of the beautiful and sublime.  
The main objects of interest in the

surrounding country are Wind Cave, Battle Mountain and Fall River Falls. Hot Springs is astir with people coming and going by coach, on horseback and via the sure-footed little burro.

The mineralogist and specimen hunter finds here a wide field for research. The cynic could avail himself of a fine piece of satire at the sight of so many people in quest of stones and horns. He might remark that everyone who comes here seems to be filled with a mad desire for a pair of horns. This is the place to paint pictures, write books, regain the health, forget the busy world, rest from business or social cares. In short, it is veritably the Carlsbad of America.
