GROCERS ASKED TO LIMIT ALL SALES

Circulars received by local grocers from the Food Administration insist that they shall limit individual sales of flour, when possible, to 24-pound sacks, and sugar to 50c worth at a time, and in so far as possible limit the sales of canned goods and other articles to the normal requirements of the purchaser, to discourage the hoarding of provisions.

Bryan County Won State Record For Peanut Yield

And a Girl Won It at That—Minnie Coon Raised One Hundred and Thirty-Eight and One-Half Bushels on a Single Acre of Ground.

Not only has the State record for yield of peanuts to the acre been won by Bryan county, but it was won by a young lady, Miss Minnie Coon, living southwest of the city, who produced 138½ bushels of the valuable nuts on one lonesome acre of ground. The information of the winning was conveyed to Farm Agent Fash from Stillwater yesterday, and the same information advised that Miss Minnie takes away cash prizes amounting to about \$100 along with the honors.

Based upon the average prevailing price, this means that the yield from Miss Coon's acre of ground was worth to her \$221.60, not including the hay, which should have almost paid for the threshing and sacks.

The acre of ground was prepared, planted and cared for under the supervision of Mr. and Mrs. Fash, and the young lady didn't have the work done—she did it herself—all of it.

Miss Minnie's sister, Miss Irma Coon, is now attending the Stillwater A. & M. school upon a scholarship which she won for the best exhibits of the culinary and canning art.

The young lady is the daughter of H. M. Coon, living three miles southwest of Durant.

The question is being freely asked whether Bryan county men propose to let themselves be outdone at man's work by a young lady?

War Hero May Speak In Durant About the War

Durant citizens may have the privilege of hearing a famous war hero speak here in the near future, if present plans do not miscarry. The Oklahoma State Council of Defense has asked if Durant wishes this speaker, and the Commercial Club has assured the State Council that such an attraction would be welcomed.

Following are extracts from the letter from the State Council of Defense: "Through the Committee on Public Information, Washington, the Oklahoma State Council of Defense has made tentative arrangements for a ten days' speaking tour in Oklahoma by Lieutenant Paul Perigord. * * * He will be in Oklahoma from January 24th to February 2nd.

Lieutenant Perigord is a strong speaker, a master of English, a graduate of the University of Chicago, and has taken part in many important battle which have been fought in France. In each of them he has been mentioned for distinguished service in the orders of the day.

"After his last serious wound he was brought to America and assigned as military attache at Camp Devens, Mass., until recently recalled by Washington for lecturing purposes. He is a valuable man."

The Commercial Association has asked that Lieutenant Perigord be assigned to Durant for one speech, and will sponsor the meeting if the speaker can be secured.
