NO STATE AD VALOREM TAX

Announcement that there will be no State ad valorem tax on real and personal property in Oklahoma for the fiscal year which ends June 30, 1921, has been made by State Auditor F. C. Carter, who says that this is the first time since statehood that such a condition has existed and that he believes no other State has such a record. There is a surplus fund of \$2,905,986 on hand in the State treasury and it is said that this will be sufficient to meet the demands upon the general revenue fund for the fiscal year when added to the gross production tax on oil, income and inheritance taxes and fees and taxes to be collected by the various State departments. The large surplus on hand is the result of the collection of delinquent income and inheritance tax collected by the State above their estimated income and the lapsing of certain appropriations. The real reason for larger collections, however, is the great prosperity of Oklahoma, which has resulted in an increase in taxable wealth, Mr. Carter says.

ELECTION CALLED IN EIGHTH CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

Governor Robertson Monday issued a proclamation calling a special election in the Eighth Congressional District to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Congressman Dick T. Morgan. The election will be held on August 3, along with the regular primary election. The term to be filled will expire March 4, next. Filings of candidates for the special election will be accepted up to July 23.

BANK ROBBERS NEED FUNDS

Tuesday during the noon hour the Athens National Bank at Athens, Texas, was entered by two unmasked men who in a business way "stuck up" the two bank employees who were on duty and a customer who happened to come in, and compelling the clerk to hand over about \$5,000, went outside, jumped into an automobile which they had in waiting, and disappeared from view.

The Altoga State Bank at Altoga, a small town nor far from McKinney, Texas, was broken into at an early hour Tuesday morning, but the burglars were frightened away before they had time to annex any of the bank's funds.

The activities along that line would seem to indicate that the members of the burglars and bank robbers union are getting hard up and have had to go to work.

BIG SEPTMEBER ROUND-UP

From all indications Durant and Southeastern Oklahoma will have the opportunity of witnessing one of the greatest outdoor entertainments ever held in Oklahoma, when the Durant Round-Up and Races, are pulled off the first four days in September.

Already the old fair grounds are being subjected to a thorough overhauling, and being placed in condition for the show. The race track is being put in shape, too, to accommodate the string of runners that are expected to be here to compete for the purses. More than \$2,000 is being offered in purses for running horses alone and this ought to insure a good program. The cow boy features are being worked still harder, some \$5,000 in purses being offered for these stunts.

CAR SHORTAGE

Car shortage during the war when rolling stock of all kinds was being impressed into service, was not nearly so bad as what is being experienced by grain men now, dealers and millers at Oklahoma City declare. One dealer says his company a year ago was handling about fifty cars of grain a day. Now they do well if they send out three cars. Elevators are full and there is no way of moving the product.

Prices are good, and the dealers say that if the car situation continues as it is, the prices will advance. Many farmers near Oklahoma City are marketing their grain by truck. Many carloads have thus been transported

to that city. All agree that the present crop is much better than anticipated early this spring.
