The character of the sentence passed upon these men was generally known for the first time when the order was issued to hang them on Friday the 19th, at Indianapolis.

The order was looked upon everywhere by a large majority of the people as unequalled and unnecessary—especially harsh when compared with the mild terms granted to men who have been for years in arms against the Union.

Aside from this consideration, the character of the tribunal which tried and condemned Mr. Milligan and his associates excited among prominent republicans a question of its legitimacy.

Condemned for want of jurisdiction by the Democracy of the entire country, high-toned Republican papers now denounce trials for political offenses by military tribunals composed too often of men who would not be permitted to act as jurors in a case involving merely the right of property.

The character of the tribunal which sentenced Milligan and his associates, is not so far above suspicion of political bias as to form an exception to the general rule.

President Johnson has respectfully declined the proffered clemency and pardon of horses tendered him by the merchants of this city, for the reason that he has ever held that those occupying high official positions should not accept such presents.

He asks, however, that he may be permitted to retain the parchment conveying the sentiments of the donors, regarding it as a mark of high respect from kind friends.
