## School Notes.

The first month of school closed at the College Friday, September 22.

Comparing this month with the first month of the two preceding years, we say without hesitation that it shows a decided improvement. The attendance is large, the interest good, and good work is being done generally.

Our new teachers show themselves well-prepared to handle the work in their respective departments. With firmness and with a determination that all demands must be satisfied, they have without an exception won the respect and esteem of all their pupils. In Prof. Dinning the young people have found a friend, a teacher and a scholar. Miss Sutton has complete control of the Intermediate Department. More interest is taken by the pupils of this department than ever before. They are not only learning from books, but they are learning other things that will specially prepare them for the great work of life. You ought to hear them sing! It makes us older ones upstairs feel like paying a visit to Miss Sutton's room during the opening exercises. There are seventy-three in this department and all without an exception have agreed to do whatever they are called upon to do in the literary society they have just organized. The literary society is an important factor in the school and these young people realize it. Stepping into Miss Miller's room the Primary Department, we look into about ninety little faces. These little folk take great interest in their work. They have a good teacher, one who is working hard and thoroughly to prepare them for promotion next year. Miss Miller has too many in her department, but in spite of the number being large, she is showing every day an ability to manage little folks.

A decided improvement lies in the stand taken by several of the boys in all the departments against the use of tobacco. They have been thoughtful and studious in regard to this matter and have decided that their work heretofore has been impaired by the pernicious habit. They realize that the use of tobacco is not only physically and mentally injurious, but that it is unclean, and that the time has come when the user of tobacco has not an equal show with the non-user in the ranks of society. We note that this desirable change is not noticeable alone in our school, but that in other schools of the County a good work is being done along this line.

The teachers headed by our worthy and ambitious Superintendent are throwing light into many dark corners. May the good work go on. Let every teacher and every pupil in the County, join hands with the Superintendent in his attempt to place Lawrence County's report at the head of the list.
