STRAWBERRIES

An Instructive Article from the **Champion Strawberry Producer in Lawrence Co.**

The first strawberry patch that was put out for market purpose that came under my notice was put out by Mr. Price and his wife, (it would be out of place not to notice her, for she was as much of a farmer as he was), who are well known to everybody living in the vicinity of Lawrenceburg excepting those who have settled here within the past four or five years.

A short article in the Lawrenceburg Press gave an account of what that little patch of about the sixteenth of an acre brought in each which as I saw the advantages offered here for cheap, home in a healthful climate. It was through that paper that I was induced to come here. The next person that came under my notice in strawberry raising was Mr. George Tripp, father of Sidney Tripp, of our town, who made the first shipments from this place and brought Lawrence strawberries to the notice of the public outside of this place and it is a very doubtful question in my mind as to whether or not the prize would have been awarded to me if he had been living and had competed but it will say this that my guess would be in his favor.

The above is the principal object that I had in view in writing this article. But it will seemingly not be complete without giving the names of others who have been in the market during the past ten or fifteen years, among whom are Messrs Loyd, Staten, Matherson, Clawson and myself. A short statement of my first real start and progress at raising berries for the market up to the largest crop that I have yet raised may be of interest and profit to some who may read this. I first sent for Biggles berry book which may be had for 50 cts at the Farm Journal Office 1024 Race Street Philadelphia, Pa., and done according to directions given in it and bought a hundred plants ten kinds ten of a kind and set them out according to the book, which was a foot between the rows and 3 feet in the row and found that they would have made a perfect mat of a bed if I had let them run, so the next spring I set out a half acre 5 feet each way and found that they all made a good matted row 3 feet wide except the Burbank.

The two next seasons I set them the same way, the third season setting a half, and the fourth an acre. I had by that time become very well aware that it takes everlastingly at it with a hoe to keep the weeds down in the matted row after they commence to run and set. So the next spring I set an acre and a half 2 feet and three inches between the rows and 6 feet in the rows, and allowed but one runner each way from the plant or two to each plant to grow one each way and kept them in the row. That summer was very rainy I hoed just around the plants in the mud two or three times before I could get on to it with a horse but I finally got at it and because of having plenty of room soon had it in good shape and had a fine stand that year. I concluded to try saving the old bed of an acre so raked the straw off the bed I could and went around the matted row with a turning plow leaving but 6 or 8 inches in the center hoping that it would run out and make a new matted row but failed to get it washed down in time so had but the

narrow rows 6 feet apart so had my new bed of an acre and a half and the old bed in that shape to pick the next season. I called it not over 2 acres. I picked and sold from that ground \$500.00 worth of berries at from 7¢ down to 5 cts a quart. That is a small income compared with Mr. Price's sixteenth of an acre, but he got 25 cts for his.
