Justice! Justice!

West Point

As our little village has the scourge of so called smallpox and a great injustice has been done, we would like to call the public attention to the way we have been treated, to commence at the first. Some four or five weeks past this scourge broke out, and it was reported that it was measles; later on, the attention of the doctors was called to it and they were divided in opinion as to what it was; after some said it was chickenpox; then it began to spread and the health officer of Lawrence County came down and he pronounced it smallpox in a very light form, and still the County Board of Health treated it lightly. The people of West Point were not satisfied, and had Dr. Albright, of Nashville, to come down and examine the cases. He only went to two places to wit: Tom Blair and Jonah Kelley. He pronounced it smallpox, and then went back to Nashville and reported twenty-seven cases in West Point and two in the country and spreading rapidly, while he was in West Point only half an hour, but still he reported twenty-seven cases in town. We don't see how he could report such, as he only visited two families while here. This he called smallpox, has been in Wayne County for the past three months, on the waters of Factory Creek, Double Branches, Shawnetee, and wagons hauling lumber every day to town and also teams are hauling lumber to Pinkney, and it is stated on good authority that drivers of some teams came to town broke out. Yet they are not quarantined against it. The people go and come as they please. There is a case at Pinkney, and all kinds of fuss in made about that case, while they are not quarantined but Mr. King has put the lid on them. Now if you put the lid on one put it on all. What is "sauce for the goose is sauce for the gander." Dr. Norman, of Waynesboro, was at West Point a few days ago to see Miss Morrison, and he pronounced smallpox in big letters. Dr. Lon Gallaher wanted him to visit several places with him, but no, he would not go, the only place he went was to Harris Hesser's, where Miss Morrison was boarding, and examined her through the window, yet he is the Health Officer of Wayne County, and we guess what he says goes.

All We want is justice, and justice we should and must have. Now if the Health Officer would use a little more judgment, and comply with the law and make no distinction in parties, and look after the welfare of the public they would soon stamp out this scourge. But when one is housed up, and let half dozen run at large who has been exposed, there is no sense or justice in such. Treat all alike, know no man, be exact, and treat all alike. Give no justice and we as citizens will not complain.
