Dear Sir, We, the undersigned members of the Anadarko Commercial Club, business men of Anadarko, and Caddo County, have been informed that the passenger train which has been and is now running between El Reno and Lawton, leaving the former city at 5:45 a. m. and returning in the evening, is to be discontinued between Chickasha and El Reno after October 5th, and respectfully petition that such course be re-considered and in support of our petition submit the following reasons.

The train referred to is the only method afforded us to conveniently reach the land office of this district and is the most convenient method of transportation to the wholesale centers of the territory.

The patronage of this train has been large and we believe it is sufficiently profitable to justify us in our petition.

El Reno is not only the location of our land office of this district but is a Commercial point we are obliged to reach and the discontinuance of this train will practically isolate us from the landoffice and seriously interfere with our commercial facilities.

In addition to the continuance of this train, we solicit your favorable consideration of the proposition to inaugurate a train service from this point west to Mangum and return to connect with the El Reno and Lawton train.

The above petition will be circulated among the citizens of Anadarko and every one should sign it, as the discontinuance of this train would seriously discomode Anadarko.

### A Trip to the Keeche Hills

Their are many places of interest to be visited by lovers of scenery landscape, Mountains and wood clad hills in the surrounding country and most of the inhabitants being strangers are unfamiliar with them. There are battle fields, (it one cares to retrace Indian tradition,) mountains, valleys and canyons that are both pleasing to the eye and also historic.

One of the prettiest spots we have been able to find, is out among the Keechi hills southeast of town at a distance of 15 miles. There upon a mountain of about 300 feet elevation, you can see the surrounding country for miles. A party consisting of Miss Christina Deck, Miss Gail Hamilton, Mr. Russell Monroe and Mr. J. A. Hill of the DEMOCRAT, with a lunch basket of no mean size, laden with all the good things the Florence Hotel is capable of producing (and by the way they were not a few, as a trial will show,) on Sunday visited these hills. The trip was an interesting one, but made more so on account of a few adventures we underwent. The country round about is as level as can be but as abruptly as a precipice rise these grand old hills that seems to be round as though hewn by human hand. The winds of ages seems to have worn them down to the hard rock and left them a thing to be admired. On an allotment of an old Indian bearing the title showing that in days gone he was a mighty warrior of his tribe, Big Whip, is a mountain of especial interest. It is about two hundred feet in diameter, about 250 feet in height and on top is as level almost as though the hand of man had hewn these hard rocks.

From it you can see that majestic range, the Wichitas including Mt. Scott, which looms up in all her glory, Mt. Sheridan to the west of her, almost as grand but not quite as high. The brightness of the day was somewhat dulled by the smoke of a prairie fire that had been raging for a day or two, which destroyed about 100 tons of hay for a man occupying a claim that takes in the point of the mountain, or the view of the surrounding country would be most grand. The party ate their lunch by a spring on the farm of Big Whip, who was the means of furnishing a singletree for the surrey which the driver, while engrossed in the beauties of the surrounding country or by the thing of beauty at his side, ran into a stump and broke. Having a camera in the party, they succeeded in securing some good views. They enjoyed themselves immensely climbing those rough and rugged mountains, returned home by the moonlight for which Oklahoma is famous.
