### Riverside Indian School

We visited Riverside Indian school Sunday and the courteous superintendent, Mr. Campbell and his pleasant wife showed us through all the various buildings and rooms.

There are in the neighborhood of 180 Indian children enrolled and they eat and sleep in the spacious buildings provided by Uncle Sam. These rooms are all neatly furnished and well cared for. A large bakery provides all the bread used, nearly 180 loaves a day, and Indian boys do the baking.

There is a manual training school where various industries are taught to the Indian youth. The sewing room, a large bright, well lighted room, is devoted exclusively to the purpose of teaching sewing to the girls. There is a Kindergarten department where the little tots are taught their A B C's and wonder of wonders to model in clay. Think of scribblers at the age of five and six. Impossible? Not at all. There are scores of well modeled cats, dogs, turtles, wagons, pappoose cradles, buffaloes, trees, birds and every other imaginable objects, all fashioned by baby fingers.

The true Indian is an artist born, and the accommodating superintendent permitted us to appropriate a few of the best pieces of this truly wonderful work.

In one of the rooms are festooned long strings of straw on which at regular intervals are little wheels of paper of every color in the rainbow arrayed with that perfect harmony, possible only to an Indian. The lady in charge of this room has a beautiful collection of rare plants and flowers. A large well furnished chapel is crowded by the Indian pupils each Sunday to listen to the weekly sermon.

In all there are about eight large buildings and they are supplied with water from a fine eighty foot steel stand pipe, which also affords ample fire protection, each building being supplied with hose and connected with the stand pipe by large mains.

They have their own gas plant which furnishes as fine lights as could be had in the most modern city. The grounds are beautifully laid out on a commanding eminence from which a beautiful view of the Agency and city may be had.

This large educational institution owes its present prosperous condition to the earnest work of Superintendent Campbell and wife, who came out from Washington, D. C., last September and took charge of the school. They are talented, sociable and courteous people, always glad to show anyone over the buildings. Mr. Campbell has asked for an appropriation to build two new brick buildings, and by next fall we hope to see them a reality. This institution would be a credit to any city and Anadarko is justly proud of Riverside school.

The first of the week, W. T. Beeks, secretary of the commercial club, received a message to the effect that the Katy road was looking toward El Reno and requesting a conference at Guthrie. The Commercial club sent the following committee: Col. Lincoln, James Sackett, W. L. Goff, J. A. Masters, Otto Shuttles, John Holt, J. T. Allison, J. E. McGrath. The committee report good progress, and have arranged today for further conference. We expect some kind of a

proposition for the location of the division, round house and repair shops in El Reno, with such permanent improvements. El Reno would continue to lead as the metropolis of the southwest.

El Reno is working earnestly for the Katy road and with the proper support from Anadarko the road can be induced to run a branch into the new country, through El Reno and Anadarko. A competing road into our city would not only aid us in the matter of freight rates but would make this a city of six or seven thousand people in the next two years. Every business man in this city should be present at the Com. club meeting tomorrow night and take an active part in the rail road discussion. We should immediately send a delegation to Guthrie to work in conjunction with El Reno.
