## WILL JUDGE CRUM BE MANDAMUSED

Governor Ferguson is seeking to have him removed, pending investigation.

### CRUM INVESTIGATION

What is Attorney General Roberts here for? Must Come Through With the Townsite Money.

Judge Finley, Probate Judge of Kiowa County has been mandamus-ed to compel him to turn all fees from his office over to the County Treasurer. If he complies it will relieve him of several thousand dollars, say fifteen. Some say that Caddo County has more townsites than has Kiowa, but this is of course irrelevant. The question is, What significance attaches to the visit at this time of Attorney General Roberts to the city. The Attorney General lays his major premise thusly. The fees charged by the probate judges in the three new counties are exorbitant, outrageous and illegal. His minor premise is: All fees in excess of salaries of probate judges, as provided by statute should be turned over to the County Treasurer, and held as county funds.

Now we will draw the only logical conclusion. If it was illegal (which means unlawful) for the probate judge to take these exorbitant fees, it would be illegal for them to be turned into the county treasurer, so the attorney generals proposition is one which would make the county a party to the crime. If these fees have been collected in violation of law, let them be turned back to those from whom they were taken. There are only two ways to remove Judge Crum. Either by the County commissioners or the grand jury. If the County commissioners refuse to act it would then be up to the grand jury, and as they do not meet until after the next election at which time Judge Crum would retire, it will make little or no difference what they do about the matter.

If the County Attorney files information it will take the case in to the district court and would entitle the judge to be tried by jury, and the powers that be are afraid the Judge might tell something in open court that would be embarrassing for the present Territorial Republican government.

Judge Crum feels sure that the County Court will do nothing in the case.

He quotes good law to prove that he is trustee for the new townsites and that as trustee he is only subject to United States laws and not under the jurisdiction of territorial law.

However these matters may be, there is certainly something rotten in Denmark.

### After Dunn, the Outlaw.

Oklahoma City, Ok., May 10. — Sheriff King, of Clarksville, Ark., arrived here today for John P. Dunn the alleged escaped murderer and bank robber, whom he thought was in custody here. Sheriff King was surprised when informed by Chief Cochran that Dunn had not been apprehended. Mrs. Dodson, the mother of Dunn, lives here and the police believe that Dunn is in hiding in this vicinity and will come here at the first opportunity. Chief Cochran has set a trap for the capture of Dunn if he comes. Sheriff King will proceed to the new country in quest of the fugitive.

Vinita, I. T., May 10. — John P. Dunn, the alleged murderer of Sheriff Powers of Clarksville, Ark., has been located in Oklahoma and a large force of deputy marshals accompanied by Sheriff King of Clarksville has left here to attempt his capture. Dunn is reported to be closely guarded by friends near Oklahoma City and a fight is anticipated before he is taken.

Powers was killed by one of the gang of bank robbers whom he surprised at work. Dunn was recently arrested in Kansas and taken to Wichita where in a controversy between the city and county officials over the reward offered for him, he escaped from a hospital. It was intimated that Dunn was aided by some of the officials and Governor Stanley instituted an investigation. Rewards aggregating \$11,000 are offered for his capture.
