The Texas Senatorship

The people of Texas have been involved in a strenuous campaign following that of the regular primaries and the state convention. Senator Bailey, who has achieved a heretofore enviable reputation as a statesman and orator is now engaged in flight of his life before the Texas legislature for re-election.

It is charged that he is guilty of improprieties which disqualify him to succeed himself. Senator Bailey admits business relations with the president of the Waters-Pierce Oil Co., but disdains that the relationship has influenced him in any way in

his official duties.

In the meantime Mr. Bryan, a man of absolute moral pose, says nothing, though he saw fit to criticize Mr. Sullivan, the National Committeeman of Illinois, because of his relationship with service corporations. Does this mean that Mr. Bryan is satisfied that Senator Bailey's record does not belie his words? One should not be hurried into believing evil things of great men, but await the result of full inquiry.


