End Thaw Litigation?

Albany, N. Y., Feb. 23.—A resolution criticising the attorney general for his attitude in endeavoring to have Harry Kendall Thaw returned to the jurisdiction of New York state was introduced by Assemblyman Golden tonight and referred to the ways and means committee. The resolution asks that the governor and attorney general be instructed to stop all extradition proceedings and incur no further expense, leaving the federal government, Thaw's native state of Pennsylvania and the state of New Hampshire, where he now is, to take such action relating to the fugitive as they deem proper.

Attorney General Carmody is to be required, by the terms of the resolution, to render an itemized account of all moneys expended in the effort to extradite Thaw.

He also is asked to explain why various persons confined in asylums for homicides when insane as was Thaw, have been discharged and some of them have escaped, without serious attempt to apprehend them.
