Twenty-five years ago the hospital field corps was an incidental adjunct of the army. It was ridiculously small.

In our civil war the wounded soldier was generally left to take care of himself where he fell until after the engagement.

The organization for relief work in the United States army is much the same as that in the armies of other civilized nations.

As he progresses toward the rear the wounded man finds a great improvement in the mode of treatment.

But it is the first aid which is the most important, and the men who render it are the most interesting.

The City of Owosso ordains: Section 1. That a standard zero or plane of reference for grades of streets, sidewalks, sewers, water pipes, and all other levels in the city be and is hereby established.

Section 2. That said plane is located thirty-one and six-tenths feet (31 6/10) feet above the center notch or recess in the corner stone of the brick building on the northwest corner of Main and Washington streets in the city of Owosso now occupied by Murray & Terhune.

Section 3. That a list of bench marks referred to in the said plane is attached to and made a part of Vol. I, of Plans of Street Improvements, and the same hereof referred to as more fully locating said plane of reference.

Section 4. That all sidewalk grades, street grades, sewer grades, and other levels established by any ordinance of the city of Owosso shall be referred to said plane, and all benches established by any ordinance of the city of Owosso shall be such work shall be recorded in said Street Improvement Book.
