REQUESTED TO RESIGN

Latest Development of the Scandal About the State Military Board.

GOVERNOR AFTER OFFICIAL HEADS

Careless Methods and Not Collision Cause the Trouble in His Opinion Legislature Makes Little Headway with Business—House Refuses to Pass a Pro-Boer Resolution—Gen. Alger Watching British Military Mistakes.

Detroit, Dec. 20.—A Tribune special from Lansing says Governor Pingree sent duplicate letters to Adjutant General Fred H. Case, Three Rivers; Quartermaster General William L. White, Grand Rapids, and Inspector General Arthur S. Marsh, Allegan, comprising the state military board, asking for their resignations because of the alleged irregularities said to have been discovered by the grand jury in their examination into the alleged sale of some \$50,000 worth of military supplies by the board to the "Illinois Supply company" for \$10,500. It is claimed that the board then purchased the same supplies, together with some others, back again from the Henderson-Ames company, of Kalamazoo, for \$62,000. The governor says that these disclosures indicate either collusion on the part of the board or failure to exercise due care in protecting the interests of the state.

Does Not Discharge the Board with Friends. The governor continues that while he thinks it was lack of care and not collusion, under the circumstances he has determined to direct that immediate steps be taken to recover the money the state has lost and to ask for the resignations of the board. Today the governor will send a special message to the legislature asking for the adoption of a joint resolution instructing Attorney General Owen to begin suit for the money alleged to have been lost in the deal.

PINGREE'S JOINT RESOLUTION

Does Not Suit His Friends in the House—Situation in the Senate.

Lansing, Mich., Dec. 20.—The house took up the Pingree joint resolution yesterday afternoon. His friends hoped that a vote would be reached before night, but the discussion in committee of the whole developed the fact that they are not themselves united, having differences on several essential points. No agreement was reached and the discussion will be resumed tomorrow. It is regarded doubtful whether the measure can get the necessary votes in the house without being materially changed.

In the senate a resolution to adjourn today until the 27th was tabled by a vote of 18 to 10. A resolution expressing sympathy for the Boers and calling on the president to act as arbitrator between the two warring nations was defeated. A copy of the house joint resolution was introduced and referred to the committee on judiciary, and in the committee discussion it was found that it did not meet the approval of a single member.

ALGER IS WATCHING THE WAR

Says Uncle Sam Did Better Than the British Are Doing.

Detroit, Dec. 20.—Former Secretary of War Alger has been watching the Transvaal war with more than ordinary interest, and so far, he says, he has found only cause for congratulation in contrasting the work of the British war office with his own. He said that the people of the country could judge for themselves of the work done in our late war, by making the same comparison.

He said: "It must be remembered that this country was much less prepared for war than England. The war department had not a single ship. Our army was yet to be organized. We had no money and could do nothing until congress made the appropriation of \$50,000,000, yet we took more men to Cuba, Porto Rico and Manila than the English have sent to Africa. We had to equip them. We had to enlist them and muster them in. We had to do a thousand things which the British have not been obliged to do."

After Some British Money.

Grand Rapids, Mich., Dec. 20.—It develops here that a syndicate of capitalists of this city has obtained an option on 300,000 acres of rich coal lands in West Virginia. Negotiations are now well along to enlist English capital in the enterprise. It is stated that the promoters of the enterprise will clean up \$250,000 in commissions if the Englishmen invest, which there is now good prospect of their doing.

Expansion's Win in Debate.

Albion, Mich., Dec. 20.—The expansionists won out from the anti-expansionists at Albion college after a spirited debate. The topic as considered was: "Resolved, That the United States should retain permanent possession of the Philippines."

Rev. Sunderland Goes to England.

Ann Arbor, Mich., Dec. 20.—Rev. J. T. Sunderland, who has been for 22 years pastor of the Unitarian church at Ann Arbor, has just accepted a call to the pulpit of the Highgate Unitarian church of London, and will leave Saturday to take charge.

Would Be a State Secretary.

Lansing, Mich., Dec. 20.—Fred M. Warner, of Farmington, was here for a few minutes and authorized the announcement of his candidacy for secretary of state.

Grist Mill Makes a \$20,000 Blaze.

Manistee, Mich., Dec. 20.—The grist mill of Lutz & Cosier, at Bear Lake, burned together with its contents. Loss estimated at between \$15,000 and \$20,000.

Charged with Forging a Sparrow Order.

Charlotte, Mich., Dec. 20.—Clare Haddix, a Mulliken youth, was bound over on the charge of passing a forged sparrow order on County Clerk Decker.

Lost His Hand While Hunting.

Albion, Mich., Dec. 20.—Karl Kopp, a molder, had his left hand blown off while hunting near here. Amputation at the wrist was necessary.

PERISHED IN FLAMES.

Two Fatal Tenement House Fires in New York.

SEVEN PEOPLE LOSE THEIR LIVES.

Three Out of One Family of Four Are Burned to Death—The Remaining Member, a Little Girl, Escaped by the Firemen, but a Sheet of Flame Had Burned Out Both Her Eyes—Mother and Son Cremated.

New York, Dec. 19.—Seven lives were lost in two big tenement houses which were destroyed by fire in this city. Five charred bodies were found on the upper floors of a burned tenement at One Hundred and Second street and Third avenue, known as the Mentor, and five women and a little girl, all badly burned, were carried from the blazing house to nearby hospitals. There is thought to be but slight chance of any of the six surviving. Several other persons only escaped from the flames and dense smoke with cuts and bruises. Three members of a family of four perished, viz: John Barrett, wife and daughter Julia, the latter 6 years old. The others dead are a woman, supposed to be Miss Annie Farrey, and Richard Nickerson, a mechanic, of Clevelannd.

Another Fatal Fire.

A few hours earlier a deadly fire attacked the five-story tenement on Tenth avenue, burning to death Mrs. Martin Fox and her child, George, 2 1/2 years old. The charred remains of both were found at the scene. Mrs. Fox is a hickman, and was not at home.

The first fire is supposed to have started in a cellar. The apartment in the building and the stairs above the fire in gaining such rapid headway that there was no successful fighting of the flames, which had gained tremendous headway when the kitchen arrived. The building was occupied by a liquor store on the first floor and on the upper floors by families. When the fire was discovered by a man named Ward the flames were coming out of the hallway. Ward could not enter the hall because of the fire and he ran into the street and threw stones at the windows.

Woman Hangs on a Ledge.

There were no fire-escapes on the front of the building. Presently Ward saw at the fourth floor window a woman hanging on the ledge, the fire having already invaded her rooms. She proved to be Della O'Connell. Her sister was also climbing out of the window and already been severely burned and half suffocated by the smoke. Both women were hanging from the window ledge when a hook and ladder truck came up. The men at once put up scaling and extension ladders and firemen climbed up. At the fourth floor another woman, Mrs. Susan McAdee, 60 years old, was found partly burned and dazed by the smoke, hanging out of a window.

Lowered to the Ground.

The firemen tied a rope around Mrs. McAdee and let her safely down. Three firemen caught the O'Connell women in their arms, but an instant too soon. Both were badly burned about the body. By this time more women and men were found at the windows, having been driven out of their rooms by the flames. A few of the people escaped by the rear, where there were fire escapes. Hook and Ladder Captain Turpeny sealed a ladder to the top floor and there found little Mary Barrett holding on to the window ledge. A sheet of flame had struck her in the eyes and burned them out.

Her Father, Mother and Little Sister were Burned to Death.

The doctors say she cannot live. Mary Searly was found at one of the upper floor windows crouching in a corner, so suffocated by smoke and too much burned to be able to help herself.

The Second Fire.

The other fire, in Tenth avenue, near Thirty-eighth started in the basement or first floor hallway and when it was discovered had such headway that it was impossible to enter. The families on the upper part of the house fled to the roof, whence they easily reached the street. The firemen on going through the house after the flames had been subdued found two bodies at the foot of the stairs on the third floor. The positions showed that the woman had been trying to carry her child up the stairs. The damage to the building by the fire was comparatively small.

Ministers May Quit Holland.

London, Dec. 19.—The Daily Mail publishes the following dispatch from Antwerp: "The British and American ministers at The Hague have asked permission to retire to Antwerp with a view of avoiding personal unpleasantness owing to the anti-British attitude of the Dutch. There is no foundation for the reports on the continent that the diplomatic relations between Great Britain and the Netherlands are strained."

Gayle Elected to Congress.

Frankfort, Ky., Dec. 19.—At the special election in the Seventh Kentucky congressional district to elect a successor to the late Congressman Evan E. Settle June W. Gayle, Democrat, of Owen county, was elected over ex-Congressman W. C. Owens, who ran as the fusion candidate of the anti-Goebel Democrats and Republicans. About two-thirds of the vote was polled. At Gayle's headquarters his majority is placed at 3,000.

Rival of American Sugar Company.

Dover, Del., Dec. 19.—The Colonial Sugar Refining company, the alleged rival of the American Sugar Refining company, was incorporated here, capital \$100,000, with the privilege of increasing it to \$100,000,000. The company is chartered to engage in the production of sugar in Cuba, Hawaii and Porto Rico. The refining is to be done by special process on the plantations.

Failure at Boston.

Boston, Dec. 19.—Dillaway & Starr, bankers and brokers of this city, have assigned. The firm is one of the most prominent of the kind in the city and is composed of Charles F. W. Dillaway, George H. Flint and A. W. Lawrence.

EVERYTHING IS AT SEA

Regarding the Outcome of the Special Legislative Gathering.

HOUSE WILL AGREE WITH PINGREE

Senate's Action an Unknown Quantity—Points for a the Governor's Message—Sensational Charges Against the State Military Board—Enthusiastic Anti-British Meeting at Grand Rapids—Osborn Goes in for Economy.

Lansing, Mich., Dec. 19.—Everything is at sea regarding the outcome of the special session of the legislature, and all sides are caucusing informally on a method of procedure. The senate adjourned yesterday afternoon shortly after the joint convention, after unanimously adopting a resolution to waive all legislative privilege and appear before the grand jury if subpoenaed. In the house the joint resolution amending the constitution along the lines laid down by Governor Pingree was introduced and referred to the committee on judiciary. Many favor an adjournment until after New Year's, while some favor the immediate passage of the resolution and adjournment this week. It is pretty certain that it will pass the house. Its fate in the senate is in doubt.

Reading of the Governor's Message.

Lansing, Mich., Dec. 19.—There was a pretty general attendance of the members at the opening of the special session yesterday and the first thing after organizing was the reading of the governor's message in which he explains why he called the statesmen together. The governor urges the passage of a proposed joint resolution so as to permit enactment of laws by the next legislature for equal taxation of all property at its true cash value. Said the governor: "The inequality of our system of taxation is so great that immediate steps should be taken to remedy it." The question involved had for years, he said, been exhaustively discussed, and was therefore no longer properly open for debate, but called for action.

Makes Some Revenue Comparisons.

The governor submitted a table showing the comparative value of railroad property in the states which most nearly resemble Michigan in population and development, and stating the value at which Michigan's railway property would be assessed if worth as much per mile as such property in the other states mentioned, viz: Indiana, Minnesota, Ohio and Wisconsin. He deduced from this that Michigan railways should pay several times the amount they now pay in taxes. He called particular attention to a clause in the 1898 platform of Michigan Republicans which commended the Pingree administration for its efforts in the direction of equal taxation.

Scandal of the Military Board.

The exposure of the alleged crookedness in the military board has created a big sensation. The allegation is that the board sold last July to the "Illinois Supply company" for \$10,500 military clothing and equipments, absolutely new, and worth \$53,000; later it is charged the board bought the same goods from the Henderson & Ames Manufacturing company, of Kalamazoo. Governor Pingree refused to talk upon the military board scandal. The board is to be further implicated on account of a flat denial from Attorney General Owen that he never advised Quartermaster General White in the matter of the alleged fraudulent sale or purchase.

MUCH SYMPATHY FOR KRUGER.

Irish, Dutch and Poles Get Together and Cuss John Bull.

Grand Rapids, Mich., Dec. 19.—One of the largest and most widely enthusiastic meetings ever held here took place in the Auditorium last night under the auspices of the United American Transvaal League, recently organized here. The great hall, the largest in the state, was completely packed, about one-fourth of the audience being ladies. There were no "deadheads," every man and woman—even the speakers, singers and vice presidents—contributing 25 cents or more to the Holland Red Cross society. The hall was decorated with the stars and stripes and Holland, German, Irish, Polish and French colors and the flags of the Transvaal Republic and Orange Free State were given prominent positions.

Speakers were selected from the various nationalities and each speaker was preceded by national anthems rendered by musical organizations of his nationality and in his native tongue. The local division of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, outnumbered by the Polish clubs and almost equalled by the German Turners and members of the Arbeiterbund. The speeches all expressed sympathy, admiration and hope of victory for the Transvaal Republic and most of them denounced England bitterly. Mayor Perry presided and the meeting did not close until after midnight.

Resolutions were adopted denouncing England, expressing sympathy and hope of victory for the Boers, and asking President McKinley to offer the good offices of the United States in their behalf. The national song of the Transvaal Republic was sung again and again, many parties of Hollanders continuing the singing on the streets while on their way home.

Reduced His Force of Clerks.

Lansing, Mich., Dec. 19.—Commissioner of Railroads Osborn has reduced his force of clerks one-half, by laying off until spring, three vice inspectors and one stenographer. Those affected by the change are Lester Canfield, Ann Arbor; Andrew DeBoer, Grand Rapids; John E. Jones, Menominee, and Dora Larooy, Holland.

Lectures on Plumbing at Ann Arbor.

Ann Arbor, Mich., Dec. 19.—A course of lectures on plumbing, heating, venting and drainage has been arranged for the engineering students in the University of Michigan. The course is given by John R. Allen, assistant professor of mechanical engineering in the university.
