### NEW BUSINESS

The application of Jay Mattison for a license to operate a five passenger automobile for hire, accompanied by a bond with James H. Lave and John H. Kelly as sureties was presented. Mr. Mattison moved that the bond be accepted, sureties approved and license granted, which prevailed, ayes DeYoung, Hanscom, Rosevear.

The following resolution was presented and on motion of Mr. Rosevear same was adopted, ayes DeYoung, Hanscom, Rosevear:

Resolution No. 689

Resolved by the Commission of the City of Owosso that it be and is hereby determined by this Commission that it is a necessary public improvement that a cement concrete curb and gutter be erected upon the north side of Williams street from North Shawwassee street to Adams street and upon the south side of Williams street from North Shawwassee street to a point 35 feet west of a point where the west line of Adams street if extended would intersect the south line of Williams street and upon North Shawwassee street from Oliver street south to the bridge over the Shawwassee river at an estimate cost of \$127 60, which includes the cost of surveys, plans, estimates, superintending, advertising and the cost of construction, to be done and the district to be assessed. And that the balance thereof be paid from the general street fund of the City of Owosso. That the special assessment district upon which the special assessment be laid is hereby bound and described as follows: All the lands or parcels of land in the City of Owosso, Shawwassee County, Michigan.

The City Assessor is hereby directed to prepare a special assessment roll for the special assessment upon the lands constituting the assessment district of said improvement for the month of July 1915, with a detailed statement of balances on the basis of frontage of said proposed improvement.

Upon filing said assessment roll in the office of the City Clerk by said assessor and it being certified by the City Assessor as provided in the charter of the City of Owosso, the City Clerk is hereby directed to give notice in some newspaper published in the City of Owosso, according to the terms of said charter for at least two weeks of the action of the commission in relation to the proposed improvement above described, of the work to be done and the district to be assessed. And that plans, specifications and estimates of the costs of said improvement are on file in his office for public inspection and at any time when the Commission will meet and consider objections thereto; and that the special assessment roll thereto made by the City Assessor for the purpose of defraying the part of the expense of said improvement to be paid by special assessment as above stated, is on file in his office for public inspection and at any time when the Commission will meet and at least two weeks after the filing of said roll, to review said assessment roll at which time and place opportunity will be given all persons interested to be heard regarding the improvement and assessment.
