REPUBLICAN REDUCTION WILL NOT MEAN RE-PLIATION.

Democratic campaign managers are out with boasts that they will redeem some of the Congressional elections they lost in November, 1920. They probably will.

But that is not admitting that there is a possibility of the Democrats winning a majority of the House of Representatives in 1922. Far from it.

In the election of 1920 many districts went Republican for the first time in history, but by a narrow margin. Quite likely we shall lose some of these if the Democrats put up candidates who are reasonably acceptable.

It is the manifest purpose of the Democratic campaign managers to pave the way for an assertion next November that a reduction of the Republican majority in the House is a repudiation of the Republican administration.

There is, in fact, but one way to ascertain the actual sentiment of the people of the country, and that is by computing the total popular vote. It is possible, but not probable, that one party might have a majority in the House but the opposite party poll the largest popular vote.

Resolved, By the Commission of the City of Owosso that permission is hereby granted to the American Malleables Company to build upon the west side of adjoining their manufacturing plant in the City of Owosso loading docks or platforms extending not more than eight feet from the west end of the building, and to erect on said plant upon and into the street, on condition that the said American Malleables Company shall file with the City Clerk a copy of an agreement executed by the President and Secretary of said corporation, and having attached thereto a duly authenticated copy of a resolution of the Directors of said corporation authorizing such execution by the said officers whereby said City shall be held harmless from any and all claims for damages of any kind against said City by any person, persons or corporation by reason of the encroachment of said platform on said Michigan Avenue, and to reimburse said City of Owosso for any and all sums which said City may be obliged to pay on account of any such claim or claims, whether by judgment or decree of a Court of Record or in settlement on advice of counsel; this permission, however, to be on the further condition that said Michigan Avenue shall not be obstructed by teams or trucks otherwise longer than is absolutely necessary for loading or unloading wagons or trucks at said platform, and that said permission is revocable at the pleasure of said City, and that, in case of such revocation, the American Malleables Company will at once remove the said docks or platforms and, in case of its failure so to do, the City shall have the right immediately so to do, and to collect the expense of such removal from the said Company.
