Dr. Lamberson shipped on Tuesday, 71 tons of cascara bork to four different firms, one shipment going to Windsor, Ontario. He has a contract on hands of 79 tons of this bark, and has it over one-half filled and he informs us that he will have no trouble in filling his contract. Credit is due the Dr. for working up this industry as it brings in foreign capital and distributes it among the needy people. He employs 5 men to handle the bark and pays them literal wages and deals on the square with the people who gather the bark.

A few days ago J. C. Gorden was arrested at Lebanon, charged with carrying concealed weapons. He was tried before Justice Hyde, attorneys Miller and Garland appeared for the defense, and J. R. Wyatt, deputy district attorney, for the proceedion. The defense took the ground that the law was unconstitutional, as it was in conflict with the provisions of the statutes providing for carrying arms in case of war, and the justice declared the law unconstitutional and discharged the prisioner. This isents the justice who granted the divorce, and places the Lebanon court above even Boise's court, for Judge Boise rarely pretends to declare a law unequatitutional, that being the province of the supreme court. Albany men who are arrested for carrying concealed weapons should always appeal their cases, in case of conviction, to justice Hyde's court, at Lebanon -Albany Democrat.

The grounds for dismissing C - case against Gorden were, that the state had failed to establish the fact that the defendant had a weapon coucealed about his person, though the evidence showed that defendant had a weapon in his hand.
