Jno. R. Lewis, of Coulee City, says the Hereford is the ideal breed for his section. He has a herd of grades which he has been steadily breeding up with Hereford bulls. He never misses the first sale of the season, which nets him 75c per hundred more than later sales procure.

A. J. Splawn's Herefords calves are sold before they put in an appearance, stockmen having orders in with him months ahead. John R. Lewis, of Coulee City, takes the two prize-winning calves of his herd. They are about as good animals of that breed as can be found in the Northwest.
