NO DISCS FOR ME.

Decide to buy a buggy with 6 wheels and 3 axles as to buy one of the "other kind" of Cream Separators. Here's the bowl.—Three pieces: Think of the saving this means, you who are washing sets of disks and poking sediment out of minute holes twice a day. Look at the narrowness of the bowl. You know what that means—"Light running". It also means that it can be driven much faster, which means "clean skimming." Notice the Supply Can—how low it is—How do you like that? You can look right down into it. There is no other machine made that has the supply can where it ought to be. All others are up two feet to two and a half higher. You cannot see into them without the aid of a stepladder. Look this matter up.
