

You Be the Judge



THE disgruntled manufacturers and agents of the "other kind" of Cream Separators (all others being of the old bucket-bowl type) try to make the dairy public believe that the TUBULAR is not what we claim it to be. It is not necessary for us to say anything further than: "You be your own judge." Turn the crank of any make of the "other kind," then turn the crank of a TUBULAR. You won't need anybody else to tell you which of the two runs easiest. The TUBULAR will tell you that itself. Then pour the tin trimmings out of the bowl of any make of the "other kind" on to a table. Unscrew the TUBULAR bowl and take out the one little piece from inside of it, and set that alongside of the other outfit. You won't need anyone to tell you which of the two is the easiest to cleanse. The TUBULAR will tell you that itself. Then cast your eye up at the high-up supply can of the "other kind," and drop your eye to the low-down supply can of the TUBULAR. You won't need anyone to tell you which of the two is the most convenient. With the "other kind" you have to hoist up the pail as high as your head to keep the supply can filled. With the TUBULAR, only as high as your waist. The one you cannot look down into without the use of a stepladder or chair. With the TUBULAR the contents of the supply can are always in view. Take the frame cover off the TUBULAR and note how strongly all parts are made and how well finished. See how absolutely positive all parts are oiled. The oiling device is far superior to any others in use with Cream Separators. The Babcock Tester will tell you that it is the cleanest skimmer. 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
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
