








One of the finest White Leghorn males alive. Had a grouch when this picture was made and positively refused to sit up and look pleasant.




“THE OLD ORDER CHANGETH, GIVING PLACE TO NEW.”




One of the new style Brood Rooms on the Tancred place. This building is 14x26 feet and at present accommodates 1200 young chicks.


A HUSKY LOT OF YOUNGSTERS.
