8883-8851 — LADIES' COAT SUIT. Comprising Ladies' Jacket pattern 8883 and Ladies' Skirt pattern 8851. Blue and white checked suiting is here shown, with white for the body of the coat. The skirt is cut with a panel front, lengthened by extensions of the side gores. The back forms a double box plait. The jacket is cut in hip length, with side front and side back seams that extend to the shoulders. A two piece and a one piece coat sleeve is provided in the pattern. The coat pattern is cut in six sizes, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40 and 42 inches bust measure. The skirt is cut in five sizes, 22, 24, 26, 28 and 30 inches waist measure. It requires nine yards of 44 inch material for the medium size. This illustration calls for two separate patterns which will be mailed to any address on receipt of 10c for each pattern in silver or stamps.





8710—CHILD'S KIMONO COAT. Pique is used extensively for coats of this kind but pongee or light weight serge will be equally appropriate. The free edges on collar and sleeve may be embroidered or braid trimmed. The coat is box shaped with a seam under the arms at the center back and a sleeve and shoulder seam in one. Pattern is cut in four sizes, 2, 4, 6 and 8 years and requires 3 3/8 yards of 20 inch material for the six year size. Pattern of this illustration mailed to any address on receipt of 10c in stamps or silver.



No. 502. SHIRT WAIST SET.

This conventional Wild Rose design will develop well in buttonhole and eyelet embroidery. It is sold stamped on 2 1/2 yards linen for \$1.75; on good quality lawn \$1.00; perforated pattern 25c; transfer pattern 10c. A skirt panel to match this design will be found under 504



No. 501. SHIRT WAIST SET.

Very artistic and appropriate. Combined with design 503, a skirt panel, this model will make a very effective gown. The pattern is adapted for solid or eyelet embroidery. Stamped on 2 1/2 yards linen, price \$1.75; stamped on 2 1/2 yards of lawn \$1.00; perforated pattern 25c; transfer pattern 10c.

8481—LADIES' OVER BLOUSE. Figured poplin in wisteria shade with trimming of velvet ribbon in darker tones was used for this design. A gump of net, lace or silk may be worn with it. The fronts and back show groups of tucks and the cap sleeve portion is likewise finished with tucks. The pattern is cut in six sizes, 32 to 42 inches bust measure. 9392—LADIES' APRON. A practical pleasing model. This neat and comfortable model may be made of gingham, percale, lawn or cambric. The bretelle portions extend below the belt forming spacious pockets over the skirt. The pattern is cut in three sizes, large, medium and small. The free edges of collar and cuffs are finished with embroidery in self color. The design is suitable for silk, crepe, flannel or flannelette. The pattern is cut in six sizes, 32, 34, 36, 38, 40 and 42 inches bust measure. It requires 2 1/2 yards of 44 inch material for a 36 inch size.
