

General News.

St. Clair county has 131 saloons. Port Huron's charter is to be revised. Sanilac county has a population of 33,944.

A new M. E. church is to be built at Lapeer. Imlay City children are now tussling with the mumps.

The Dr. McGurk will contest has been discontinued.

A Bay View Reading Circle will be organized in Armada.

Harvey Mentor, of Marlette, died recently, at the age of 92 years.

During the past year there were 439 marriages in St. Clair county.

Charles R. Mallon, of Port Huron, is insane and will be sent to the asylum.

The taxes of Gurley Lester, of Capac amount to over \$1,300 in Michigan this year.

A Sanilac County hunter shipped 75 rabbits to Port Huron one day last week.

Capt. Wm. Lalfour, a well known St. Clair vesselman, died last week of consumption.

One of the oldest men of Imlay City was drunk on the streets the other day. A sad spectacle.

The Almont creamery has been leased to a New York man and is now ready for business.

There were 248 deaths in the city of Port Huron during the year 1894, nearly one-half being children.

C. E. Patterson has started a monthly paper at Columbiaville, in the interests of Michigan Foresters.

Sarah B. Langguth, of Flint, has been engaged to teach the Grammar department of the Capac schools.

Mrs. Nathan Conat, of St. Clair, was burned to death recently, her dress catching fire from a gasoline stove.

Twenty-five citizens of St. Clair county have within the past year, filed wills with the Judge of Probate.

The 6-year-old trotting stallion, Onward, belonging to Charles Dryer, of New Haven, was found dead in the barn.

There are ten salt blocks in St. Clair county, 6 steam and 4 pan blocks and a total capacity of 600,000 barrels a year.

Grace Kelly, a domestic in the St. James hotel, St. Clair, was badly burned while polishing a hot stove with blacking mixed with gasoline. The stuff took fire.

A Pullman sleeper caught fire near Lenox on Christmas night and the occupants escaped into the coaches ahead in their night clothes. The car was saved after some fighting.

Palmer T. Winchel, a blacksmith about 60 years of age, whose home was at Almont, but who was employed by the Fuller Buggy Co., at Jackson, was crushed to death by their elevator last week.

Edward Young, who has run the stage between Sanilac Centre and Carsonville for the past six years, will now move to Croswell as he has the contract for the stage route between Croswell and Lexington.

The county officers who retired on January 1st are Sheriff Jacob Bernatz, Deputy Sheriffs Carleton and Myron, County Treasurer Henry F. Marx, Deputy County Treasurer Canon Smith and Superintendent of the Poor Friend Palmer.

Some miscreant placed a lorry upon the track of the F. & P. M. at Uby the other evening and it came near sending a passenger train off the track. As it happened the only damage done was a broken pilot and a lot of scared passengers.

Vassar and the tramp fraternity seem to be having a hard time. After the four had been caught recently, no more appeared until one night last week when one attacked H. C. Dean, a prominent merchant, and knocked him senseless with a club. Everybody now goes armed.

Dr. O.M. Stephenson and Mrs. Frank Millis, formerly of Port Huron and who eloped from there six months or more ago, were married in Dakota December 25, where they have passed as brother and sister. Stephenson has a wife in Port Huron from whom he has procured a divorce and Mrs. Millis husband died just before her elopement. The elopees have few friends left in Port Huron.
