

OUR DEAD HEROES

Were Remembered by Strewing Their Graves With Flowers.

Appropriate Songs and Addresses in Central Hall.

After the stormy, cold weather of the past week, Thursday morning as it dawned bright and warm seemed a Godsend. Although partly clouded through the day the atmosphere was warm and early in the day the streets became lined with vehicles and people, come together for the purpose of observing this Decoration day in a befitting manner. The buildings on both sides of Main street were tastily trimmed with bunting and waving flags, and many residences hoisted Old Glory. The business places were closed from 10 to 2.

At 10:30 the G.A.R. Post met at their hall and formed in line. The Macca-bees did likewise and all marched on Main to Mechanic street up Mechanic to Jones where they met the pupils from the different departments of the high school. Then up Jones to the corner of North street where they met the pupils of the primary rooms and all marched to the cemetery followed by citizens on foot and in carriages.

The service at the graves of the soldiers was gone through with with reverence and impressiveness and flags and bouquets were bestowed upon the silent resting places of our veterans. Other graves were also profusely decorated with the beautiful flowers.

In the afternoon a fair sized audience in Central hall listened to stirring speeches by J. B. McIlwain, of Port Huron, E. H. Drake, and Fr. Cullinane. The occasion was also enlivened by music from the Male Quartette.

Memorial day services were commemorated last Sunday afternoon in the Presbyterian church. A large concourse of people gathered together with twelve or fifteen old soldiers to hear the eloquent and appropriate sermon delivered by Rev. Ellis. His words were listened to with the greatest attention, especially by the veterans, as he spoke of different scenes of the war, which must have brought back vividly to their minds recollections of events through which they had passed themselves. Memorial day is one which all love to honor. Although many years have passed since the civil war and comparatively few veterans are left, the feeling is patriotic indeed and probably the day will always be observed with the same reverence. The singing by the choir added much to the impressiveness of the occasion and was heartily enjoyed by all.

Drowned at Port Huron.

Howard Hickey, the 14-year-old son of John A. Hickey, manager of the Truesdell Marble Co., was drowned in Black river Saturday, while boating. Mr. Hickey's friends in his neighborhood sympathize with him in his sorrow. A party of seven or eight lads were playing in the water with an old scow and in an attempt to push the boat from the shore several of them were precipitated into the water. The others fell into the shallow water near the shore and succeeded in getting out but the Hickey boy went into the deeper channel and assistance could not reach him. It took about an hour dragging the bed of the channel to find the body and by that time all efforts to resuscitate him proved useless. The grief of the parents upon learning of the sudden death of their first born was better imagined than described. It was certainly a pitiful scene to witness and it is said that the mother was almost crazed by the shock. The funeral took place Tuesday morning at 9 o'clock from St. Stephen's church, Port Huron.

Grange Organized.

A Roman Catholic Appeal.

An appeal to the Roman Catholic people of the United States and Canada for money with which to build Catholic properties destroyed in the Jacksonville fire has been made by the Rt. Rev. John Moore, bishop of St. Augustine. Practically all the Roman Catholic property of Jacksonville was in the path of the fire. The destroyed buildings consisted of the Church of the Immaculate Conception, valued at \$20,000; the parochial residence, valued at \$18,000; St. Mary's Home for Orphan Children, valued at \$20,000, and St. Joseph's Convent, valued at \$45,000. Worship is now carried on in two tents furnished by the government. The Roman Catholic congregation of Jacksonville comprises only about 3 per cent of the population and is impoverished, so that it cannot contribute to the rebuilding.
