The I. O. F.

The Independent Order of Forest-
ers are inaugurating a vigorous winter
campaign, and for two months of No-
vember and January are
remitting to new members the registra-
tion and certificate fees, which
applicants usually have to pay upon
joining. The order has made wonder-
ful strides during the year, and will
add to its membership many thou-
sands during the next three months.

Its membership roll now contains a
good deal over 200,000 of insured or
beneficiary members. Its accumulat-
ed funds reach almost \$6,000,000; and
these funds are increasing at the rate
