IMPRESSIVE SERVICES

The funeral obsequies of the Rev. Dr. H. D. Hunter, pastor of the Presbyterian church in Yale for the past two years, were held, as noted last week, from the church at 2 p. m.

From ten in the forenoon many came to look upon the face of the beloved minister of the gospel for the last time on earth, scarcely realizing that it was a last farewell, so short had been the time since he walked among them. The casket was covered with beautiful flowers, pure and emblematic. By half past one the church was filled to its capacity and the services were

begin at two without the usual tolling of the bell. The full chorus choir were in their accustomed places and rendered three favorite hymns of the pastor's.

A dozen ministers were present from different points and from Yale, most of them taking part in the services. The opening prayer was given by Rev. John Caldwell, of Sandusky; Rev. Walker, of Vassar, read a chapter of scripture; Rev. Geach of Yale gave a good talk on "Appreciation." "The Commission of a Minister" was assigned to Rev. A. Caldwell of Marietta; "The Work of a Minister" to Rev. McCarroll; "Joy in Service" to Rev. Bouyou of Marietta; "Summary" by Rev. Bradford, of Lapeer; Rev. Bragg closed the services at the church with prayer. At the grave in Elmwood cemetery where the interment was made, Rev. Bouyou of Yale read the 23rd Psalm; Rev. Phillips of Yale the Lord's prayer and Rev. Bradford gave the benediction.

Mrs. Hunter takes this opportunity of expressing her heartfelt appreciation to all who so kindly gave her the many manifestations of their sympathy during her recent bereavement.


