### HERE AND THERE

Harbor Beach will soon have free delivery of mail.

The Thumb League pennant was won by Marlette.

Thirteen mail routes were discontinued in Sanilac county October 1st.

Thomas Parker, of Armada died last week at the age of eighty-six years.

Sandusky merchants are paying three prices for eggs, according to the quality.

Geo. H. Jones, for thirty years postmaster at Shabbona, is now succeeded by William Auslander.

The forty-third annual exhibition of the Armada Agricultural Society, held last week, was, as always, a successful affair.

The marble works and chicken hatchery of E. B. Thatcher in Marine City, were destroyed by fire last week with a loss of over \$5,000.

J. A. Heath, of Richmond, manager of the defunct Richmond Elevator Company, died Sunday night after an illness of two years.

The Neddermeyer Co.'s store at Richmond was burglarized one night last week and a hundred dollars worth of men's clothing taken.

With last week's issue the Armada Times entered its fifth year of existence. The Times seems to be filling its niche very successfully.

Fifty men are working on the new court house at Sandusky and it is expected that the building will be enclosed by the first of November.

Work on the new Presbyterian church at Marlette is progressing rapidly and it is probable the dedication of the structure will be set about December 1.

Robert Skinner, of Burlington, Iowa, 23 years old, and a railroad man, attempted to board a moving train, but tripped and fell under the wheels, being killed instantly.

A fire destroyed the barn on the Stevenson farm north of Imlay City last week, with the season's hay and grain crop and tools. Fire supposed to have been caused by heating grain.

The sugar beet factory at Crosswell will commence operations about the 15th of the month. The crop is so small this season that the run will not last more than half the usual time.

Farmers around St. Clair growing cucumbers this season are out their pay as the firm who bought them found themselves bankrupt after gathering in the pickles. Between \$2,000 and \$3,000 is due the farmers.

A 15-year-old North Branch boy received a dislocation and fracture of the lower jaw while playing the popular game pull-a-way on the school ground. The injury was serious enough to send the boy to Detroit for surgical treatment.

As Al Cotten, of Port Huron was returning from Lexington last Sunday with Mr. and Mrs. Gilbert Sample and Mr. and Mrs. Alonzo Long, fire was discovered under the machine. The passengers just had time to get out when the car was ablaze. It was a total loss.

Peck and Watertown now boast of being officially on the railroad map of Michigan since the big free excursion last week to Bay City. One thousand people boarded the train at Peck and fourteen coaches were filled to capacity after Sandusky loaded up. A great day was had.

The Lexington township board has appointed James Tait, a man 85 years of age, to the office of constable for the remainder of the year. Mr. Tait has served for 46 years as under sheriff, deputy sheriff and constable. It is said that he is the oldest elected constable in the United States today.



### Work of County Agriculturist

The greater portion of last week was occupied in checking up the work of seed associations. Mr. Larsen of the Agricultural College arrived in the county on Tuesday morning and assisted with the work. The Agricultural college originates and breeds up these different varieties of grains, and Mr. Larsen's object in visiting the county at this time was to ascertain for the College how they were adapted to local farm conditions. There are now about seventy-five men in St. Clair county growing these seeds, so judging from all reports it is safe to conclude that no other county in Michigan is carrying on the work to such an extent.

On Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday members of the Kimball, Capac and Burchville associations were visited. Those growing worthy oats reported good fields and their observations led them to believe that this variety stood up better during the wet weather than the native varieties with which they have been compared. Owing to the fact that a considerable quantity of each man's crop was lost during harvesting, it is impossible to accurately compute the yields. The beans that were distributed were all drowned out with the exception of those secured by one member whose field was so wet they were not planted. The larger portion of the corn introduced into the county by this office last spring was of the Golden Glow variety and, while it didn't get thoroughly matured in all cases, it is believed that during an ordinary year it will just about use the season and will prove a desirable corn for this locality. The observations regarding the soy beans which were distributed were very interesting as this crop has thrived and given good yields on excessively wet soil.

Thursday was spent on Harsen Island with Mr. Stapleton of the Live Stock Sanitary Commission. It was considered necessary to adopt more strenuous measures in handling the hog cholera situation and a dog quarantine was placed upon the island requiring that all dogs be chained. Personal notices were served on dog owners in addition to posting public ones, and the Commission has ordered that all persons violating this quarantine be arrested, the penalty being a fine, imprisonment, or both. It has now become the duty of the County Agent to see that these regulations are observed and enforced.

A matter that should be of particular interest at this time is the two-year course in agriculture given at the Michigan Agricultural College. This begins October 25th and closes February 25th of each year. The course is primarily designed for people who do not find it practicable to take a full four-year course. The work given in agriculture is almost identical with that given in the regular four-year course and affords an excellent opportunity for people who wish to take work along this line. A number of folders are on file at this office which can be had for the asking. The County agent will also be glad to give a personal explanation of this work to anyone desiring it.
