3.95 miles in Brockway Twp. A brief description of the road is as follows: Beginning at the 1/4 corner common to sections 14 and 15, T. 8 N. R. 14 E., running thence southerly between sections 14 and 15 to the S. W. section corner of sec. 14, thence W. between sections 15 and 22 to the E. 1/4-1/4 corner common to sections 15 and 22 thence S. on the east N. & S. 1/4-1/4 sec. line through section 22 to the E. 1/4-1/4 corner common to section 22 and 27, thence westerly between sections 22 and 27 to the 1/4 corner common to sections 22 and 27; thence southerly on the N. and S. 1/4 line thru sections 27 and 34 to the 1/4 corner common to section 34 T. 8 N. 


