


Texas Not for a Curb On Draft of Players

Joe Gardner, Who Speaks for Himself a la Tarnsey, Thinks It All a Class AA Scheme.

DALLAS, Tex., Dec. 2.—The action of the National association in declaring "war" in the majors and passing the "antidraft" resolution did not make much of a hit with the class B circuit known as the Texas league, though President Walter Morris does seem to favor it a great deal to the majors, and while the opinion of the writer may not bear much weight with the powers that be, it is felt that he should lodge an emphatic protest against the policy of the AA leagues to throttle the interests of the small minors, which they consider so bad, on the little fry in the National association. If the draft is good for the AA leagues to put on the class league, why is it not good for all leagues?

Joe Gardner, formerly owner of the Dallas club, and well versed through his 20 years of experience in baseball with all its politics and maneuvering, is of the opinion that the AA leagues are not to be trifled with, and when their teams meet on the field of battle, there is always a hard fought struggle. Would Make Class AA Majors. It means that the class AA leagues would become virtually major leagues in effect, as players could not be drafted from them, while they are permitted to draft from the other classes. The Texas league draft price by the majors is now \$1,200 and to class AA \$750. Thus it is plainly seen that the AA leagues may come in and draft a man from the Texas league for \$750, whereas under the old rule the majors would give \$1,200, so the Texas league stands to lose \$450 on a player of major league caliber.

ALL salary limit has been placed on the AA leagues, while the salary limits of the lower leagues have been cut. Of course the lower leagues would stand no chance to get a good player if the AA went after him.
