THREE MEMPHIANS REPORTED WOUNDED

Three Memphis boys are named in Monday's casualty list, one having been accidentally killed and two wounded.

Private Paul H. Christian, 21, of Battery E, 51st field artillery, 1st division, was struck by a locomotive on Jan. 14 and fatally hurt, according to official telegram to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. D. M. Christian, 1408 South Lauderdale street.

He enlisted April 27, 1918, and wrote his parents after the armistice he emerged safely.

Corporal John E. Jennings, of Battery A, 11th field artillery, was gassed on Nov. 7 during a German bombardment of the Argonne forest, he has written his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Jennings, 1215 Neptune street. On Dec. 18 he wrote that he was rapidly recovering. He enlisted with Lieutenant W. J. Bacon's 11th machine gun battalion, but was transferred, before enlistment he was with his father in the levee contracting business.

Private Charles H. Rainey, who enlisted from route 8, Nashville, is a brother to Bob Rainey, of The News Scimitar's composing room force. Only meager information has been received as to how he received his serious

wounds. He was struck on Sept. 25 with shrapnel and underwent an operation. Last reports indicated he was recovering. He was with a company of engineers.

PLEASURES OF THE GARDEN

Farmers in Memphis Territory Will Do Better Work--Many Small Purchases of Garden Seed--Mules at Top Prices.

A survey of farming and gardening prospects in this section for the season of 1918 through the eyes of seed dealers, implement firms, mule sellers and structural experts elicits a wide variety of opinion and information, much of which is contradictory. Summing it all up, it seems that the outlook for the year is much more than an average, normal year, though the fact is established that the farmers of the South are going to use more improved cultivating implements on their lands this year than ever before. They are purchasing unusual numbers and varieties of plows, of two-horse cultivators, corrugated pulverizers, disc harrows, spike-tooth harrows and in the matter of heavy, costly tractor implements they are investing in surprising numbers.

The advertising manager of the Southern branches of one of the largest farming implement establishments in the country, which specializes in tractor farm machinery, judged this unusual demand for tractor implements to indicate a decision on the part of the Southern farmers to plant less cotton this year and plant a larger acreage to forage and food crops. In refutation of this, however, Dr. E. R. Lloyd, director of the Memphis Chamber of Commerce farm bureau, expressed the view that the shortage of farm labor is forcing the purchase of tractor plows, harrows and pulverizers.

Sales Break All Records. Another implement dealer, whose concern, by the way, does not handle tractor implements, believes that there is no more demand for tractor implements by the implement trade, on the part of Southern planters to reduce their acreage of cotton. He said that his firm has had the best January sales record in its history and that the farmers of the South are undoubtedly more awake today than ever before to the value of improved machinery, but that the machinery which they are now buying is such as to be used for the cultivation of cotton and corn almost exclusively. His expressions on the outlook were very optimistic and looks like the farmers are going to stick tight to cotton, and if they do it will damage the country severely. It will make collections mighty bad in the agricultural districts.

Fair Demands for Oats.

Dealers record a fair demand for spring oats, which is showing signs of growing better. Good cleaned oats for seed is being quoted at \$1.15 to \$1.25 and \$1.25 to \$1.35. This is in lots of five to 25 bushels, according to one dealer, and by virtue of the fact that oats is sold on a very close margin larger lots could probably be purchased at better rates.

The condition of the garden seed market would indicate a great deal of home gardening this year. The dealers are receiving very large orders from retail dealers and truck gardeners, but they are receiving large numbers of small orders. It is thought that the psychological effect of the mild weather on the back yard gardener is causing this demand. Despite the fact that it cost more last year to produce the seed which is being sold this year than ever before, the price is in general no higher than in the spring of 1918 and in many instances lower. Peas and beans are cheaper than last year and there is a good demand for seed peas, beans and onion sets.

Going back a moment to the heavier farming, it might be well to mention one dealer's statement that there is usually good demand for fine seed corn, indicating that the South will put in more and better corn this year than last.

Cabbage Plants Plentiful.

It is too early yet to talk of tomato plants and, in fact, the factors say that not until two weeks from now will the real seed-buying season come. Then, they say, it will be easier to get a genuine sense of conditions.

The demand for frost-proof cabbage plants is good, but it is generally to look at the cold frame market. One dealer quotes the frost-proof plant at \$2.50 per cent the 100 to the 1,000, while another quotes at \$3 per 1,000, f. o. b. Memphis.

It would be well for the farmer and gardener to buy seed this year from dealers in whom he has confidence. There is said to be a tendency on the part of less scrupulous dealers to unload at reduced prices old seed stocks, often of doubtful quality, which they believe they will have a chance to re-stock at lower prices than they paid for present stocks.
