CLEVELAND, O., Feb. 14.—The United States government has 20,000 motorcycles in France in the dispatch service. Frank F. Weascher, chairman of the war service committee of the motorcycle industry, told directors of the Motorcycle Trade association at a meeting here.
These machines, he said, will be used in government service, a large number probably by the postoffice department in rural districts.
The association has decided to resume motorcycle shows, competitive races and hill-climbing contests in 1918.

Pete Got by Easy

Pete Monteverde, brother of the mayor, behind the scenes of M. J. Kline & Co., operated a stand at Third street and Main street, public property. His license for that stand was \$7.75, when he complained that it was a poor widow and needed every cent he could get.
A few days ago the stand was seized by the police. The stand was for operating half a dozen tamales and wieners, which are now being sold on public property. He was referred to the office on the opposite side of the hall. On Jan. 7 he paid for \$15, \$2.50 a stand for six stands, signed "Pete Monteverde," was paid over to the collector. Note, Pete's brother of the mayor, got by with \$2.50 a stand while Lucas had to pay \$10.25.

Mrs. Latura Let Off Easist

On Dec. 26 Mrs. Latura, aunt to the mayor, according to the books of the collector's office, paid \$20 as license for ten stands on the 11th of May, 1917, for \$3 a stand. No explanation has been given as to why the rate granted Pete and Mrs. Latura differed so materially from that forced out of Lucas and Mrs. Waycaster before Mrs. Waycaster made her complaint and got the stand taken to Pete's, but it still remains 25 per cent above that of Mrs. Latura.
Other persons who paid partly on their 1918 hamburger, tamale and wieners license was J. Levy, 22 Union avenue. He paid \$20 on seven stands for the month of December, totaling \$175.
Commissioner Mason said that the office was collecting licenses from persons who never paid before. "The charges had no way of getting any one by is untrue," he declared.
Commissioner Mason said that inasmuch as most of the stand had been taken by on police permits, but had not had the records of the collector's office to show the records they gave the information by bringing them to get Mason to cut the practice out all records were destroyed. So Pete's word was taken for the stands he, or M. J. Kline & Co., operated.

YAZOO CITY HOLDS COTTON CONFERENCE SATURDAY

YAZOO CITY, Miss., Feb. 14. (Sp.)—P. P. Garner, commissioner of agriculture of Mississippi, is to be the principal speaker at an assembly of representative farmers, planters and business men at the courthouse in Yazoo City on next Saturday afternoon, 10 o'clock. The meeting has been called at the instance of the cotton men and planters of the county, and is to be held for the purpose of discussing the present cotton, and to take such steps as may be thought necessary to secure a better price for next season's crop. The meeting is a local response to a proclamation issued by the governor of Mississippi, calling a meeting at the county seat of every county in the state to formulate plans for the recovery of Mississippi agriculture this year and for the greater diversification of crops for the coming season.

REPORTS OF REBELLION IN ROMANIA UNCONFIRMED

LONDON, Feb. 14.—Reports of a rebellion in Rumania have been current for some time, but no definite details, but all have emanated from German or Austrian sources and have not been confirmed by any of the interested parties. The Rumanian legation here knows nothing of any outbreak and knows that the reports are untrue. It is known that the German and Austrian legations have been working hard to bring about a rebellion in Rumania, and the deposition of the dynasty.

HIGH WINDS REPORTED IN MIDDLE WEST STATES

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14.—The middle western disturbance today was centered over the Ohio valley, moving very slowly and with an abnormally low barometer over the eastern half of the continent, and continued over the low area with some snow in its northern and western boundaries. The disturbance is expected to reach the Ohio valley, but with temperatures still above the seasonal average.
Fair weather is indicated for tonight and Saturday in the South. It will be colder tonight in the lower Mississippi valley, and Saturday in the northern portion of the middle Atlantic district. Storm warnings still are displayed on the Atlantic coast from Virginia to Boston.

SOUTHERN TROOPS SAIL FOR HOME IN FIVE SHIPS

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14.—The 46th regiment coast artillery, which comprises a large number of Southern men, many from South Florida, is among units aboard three transports and the battleships Rhode Island and Virginia, which have sailed from France with 470 officers and nearly 12,000 men.

U. S. INVITED TO MEET

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14.—The United States has been invited through the Paraguayan legation in Buenos Aires to the second pan-American congress for the welfare of the child, to be held at Montevideo, Uruguay, on Feb. 15 to 18. The congress will meet for industrial plants in Memphis during the past two weeks for the government.

FURIOUS MIXED STORM HOLDS CHICAGO FAST

CHICAGO, Feb. 14.—The storm accompanied by snow, wind and rain, which for 24 hours has demoralized the city, today with heavy traffic jams, wire communication and railway traffic in the territory between the Missouri and the Canadian border in Oklahoma, early today was still in progress and moving eastward, though with decreasing severity.
While the snowfall in most localities was comparatively light, high winds, especially in Nebraska, Oklahoma, Kansas, caused huge drifts which delayed rail traffic. All freight trains were annulled and only a few passenger trains were able to get through the snow. The snow was so deep that it was necessary to dig out the tracks. The wet snow and high winds caused unusual difficulties for telegraph and telephone lines.
No locality reported cold weather, temperatures being well above zero and most places above the freezing point.

SICK AND WOUNDED FROM FRANCE REACH NEW YORK

NEW YORK, Feb. 14.—The steamship Finland and the cruiser Charleston arrived here today with troops from France. The Finland brought 3,353 men, of whom 224 are sick or wounded. The majority of the men on the vessel were casualties from the East and Middle West, and aboard also was base hospital No. 1 and the brigade headquarters of the 4th coast artillery corps.
The Charleston brought 1,271 troops, of whom nearly all were of the 2nd regular coast artillery corps (regular army). There were a few casual officers aboard.

Some years ago Creatore with his band was the musical sensation in Memphis. Eccentric to the limit, he was an artist to the marrow of the bone and a skilled, if erratic, conductor. He gave many concerts here.

The delegates will leave Memphis Sunday afternoon at 4:45 for the Yazoo & Mississippi Valley. They are A. L. Parker, J. K. Salisbury, Charles J. Haase, E. W. R. Lloyd, A. E. Jenkins, M. P. Stridman, E. L. East, R. W. Bailey, W. N. Wilkerson.
Increase in the production of food and feed crops and reduction of the cotton acreage will be one of the leading questions before the association's meeting.

MERIDIAN MAN KILLS NEGRO WOMAN; IS IN JAIL

MERIDIAN, Miss., Feb. 14. (Sp.)—W. F. Hodnett, a well-known white Memphis, and instantly killed Blanche Hodnett, a negro woman, late sent to jail. Hodnett claims that the woman assaulted him with a knife, while witnesses state that he shot her during a quarrel. He is in jail charged with murder.

ARKANSAS ACTUARIAL BUREAU KILLED BY HOUSE


ARKANSAS REFUSES TO CHANGE NAME'S SPELLING
