

NOTED SHELBY JURIST PASSES TO HIS REWARD

Judge Jacob Scudder Galloway, aged 81, for 32 years judge of the probate court of Shelby county and one of the best known citizens of Memphis, died at his home, 219 Garland place, Sunday night at 8:45 o'clock of arterial sclerosis, after an illness of about four weeks.

The funeral was to be held from the home with services at St. Mary's cathedral Monday afternoon. Pallbearers named were John C. McLemore, Edward Crenshaw, T. H. Jackson, George Fieser, Phil Canale, R. G. Brown, F. L. Monteverde and Tate Pease.

Judge Galloway, through his continuous service on the probate bench in Shelby county, had the distinction of presiding over the only court of this kind in the state and was considered the oldest judge in Tennessee and probably in the South.

MONS APPEAL TO WILSON FOR NEUTRAL FOOD CRISIS PROBE

LONDON, Feb. 24.—Thirty-six prominent members of scientific and medical faculties of German universities and 22 mayors of leading cities in that country have addressed a joint note to President Wilson and university faculties in neutral countries, urging the speedy adoption of a commission of experts from the Scandinavian states, Holland, Switzerland and Spain, for the purpose of studying the food situation in Germany.

Among outstanding features of the final week will be President Wilson's conference at the White House with the foreign relations committee, on the issue of the proposed daily discussions of the league proposal in the senate, selection by the house Republicans at a conference Thursday of a candidate for the membership of the next house, and the final rush of appropriation bills and other urgent legislation.

NOTED LAW AUTHORITY AND T. R. FRIEND DIES

NEW YORK, Feb. 24.—Abraham J. Dittenhofer, noted authority on international copyright law, and claimant to the distinction of having introduced Col. Theodore Roosevelt to political life in the old 21st assembly district, died at his home here aged 81 years. He was born in Charleston, S. C.
