DEFENSE AGAINST CRUISE SHOOTING

Police Fail to Find Clues to Trace Slayer of Car Conductor.

Police and detectives found no new developments Tuesday in the mysterious assassination of Ben Gibson, young street car conductor who was shot Sunday night as he boarded his car at Florida street and Y. & M. V. railroad tracks after flagging the cross-

The general theory around police headquarters is that none of the three negroes who were wounded by bullets fired by Motorman M. W. Booker shot Gibson.

Booker told Joe Burns, chief of police, that when Gibson fell at his feet, motionless, he thought at first the conductor possibly had shot himself.

Knowing that Gibson always left the car at the railroad crossing to flag the crossing, it is argued at police headquarters that some of the negroes possibly waited in the darkness to get Gibson, as some of them are said to have mumbled on leaving the car.

There was no mob Tuesday night, and since the last dispersing of a gang of men at the county prison early Monday, no open threats against the negroes have been made.

STREET RAILWAYS TO BE CHECKED UP

President Suggests Investigation of Distressed Systems by National Commission.

WASHINGTON, May 20.—President Wilson has called for approval of a plan submitted by Secretaries Redfield and Wilson for the relief of the electric railway systems of the country now in the hands of receivers or threatened with insolvency.

The plan as outlined in correspondence made public today at the White House involves an investigation of general franchise and operating conditions in their relation to rates by a federal commission composed of representatives of the treasury, commerce and labor departments, the National Association of American Manufacturers, American Cities' League of Mayors, Amalgamated Association of Street Railway Employees, American Electric Railway Association and the Investment Bankers' association of America.

In announcing his approval, the president asked Secretaries Redfield and Wilson to forward their suggestions as to a person or persons of the commission at the earliest possible time.

Quinn To Succeed Wills, Is Latest Political Rumor


