(Continued From First Page.) their hesitation in this respect is really dictated by caution rather than a fear of the presidential veto, cannot, of course, be discovered, but the party leaders evidently have already assured the manufacturing elements in the Republican party that not much can be done in the immediate future.

Senate and the Treaty

Once the American mission in Paris puts its signature on the peace treaty and all the parties signify their adherence in the same way, it may take six months to a year to amend and President Wilson and the American mission will return to the United States, leaving the regular plenipotentiary ambassadors at various countries which are signatory to the peace treaty.

Want Reservations

To this end certain senators want reservations made. They are anxious that joint resolutions be adopted by congress now, stating specifically what American understandings by certain items in the peace treaty, if they ratify the document as a whole and then add specific reservations, these will be valid or invalid in the future, according as the legislative and executive branches of congress in coming years want to assert or defend the principle involved in the reservations.

League of Nations

But limitation on the activities of the American representatives in any league of nations and specific instructions as to their obligations to refer to the American senate certain questions involving the making of treaties, conventions, or even informal agreements are clearly within the province of congress.


