

TRADE TRAINING GETS BIG BOOST

Nation, State and City Operate for Education Useful to Workers.

Extension of the facilities for vocational education in order that railroad shop employees and the employees in factories and retail establishments in Memphis may have the opportunity of improving their education and knowledge along the lines of industry which they are following is being contemplated in Memphis.

E. S. MacIn, state supervisor of industrial trades and education, of the Tennessee department of education, reached Memphis Friday morning and during the day conferred with Prof. Wharton S. Jones, superintendent of education and Prof. J. L. Highsaw, principal of the Crockett Vocational high school.

The value of part time education along vocational lines is being recognized throughout the nation by business men and employers, and under a recent ruling of the railroad administration, shop employees are permitted a certain period of time from their work for educational purposes, according to Mr. MacIn.

During the day an inspection of the work planned for the Crockett Vocational high school under Prof. Highsaw's direction was made by Mr. MacIn and plans for the extension of the work were also taken up. A portion of the state vocational education fund has been allocated for the part time education, according to MacIn, and the matter of establishing facilities in Memphis for this work is to be gone into considerable extent.

The retail merchants of Memphis are greatly impressed with the part time educational work, according to Prof. Jones, who has for a number of years been an advocate of the work. Prof. Jones will afford Mr. MacIn every cooperation possible looking to the establishment in Memphis of additional vocational educational facilities. Mr. MacIn is an enthusiast on the subject of vocational training and has quoted one employer as stating that his concern could afford to pay its employees twice the salary they were receiving if they were trained under the vocational plan for their work. Employers are realizing that vocational education means the elimination of a big item of waste and for this and other reasons are encouraging their employees to avail themselves of the opportunities for securing proper training under the part time educational plan.

LABOR COUNCIL HELPS TO FIGHT INJUNCTION

A committee to co-operate with the Building Trades Council and Factory Workers' local committees in raising funds to fight a federal injunction was named by the Trades and Labor Council at a meeting held Thursday evening. The committee is composed of E. M. Vaughn, Charles Gray and Will Fowler. The injunction referred to is the temporary one secured by the Weis & Leah Manufacturing company to prevent members of the factory workers' union from picketing their plant at Pennsylvania street and Division avenue. The injunction was granted by Judge John E. McCall and Weis & Leah are now making plea that it be made permanent.
