White Sox Captain and Second Baseman Celebrates Anniversary of Big League Entry.

Eddie Collins on Sept. 16 celebrated the anniversary of his appearance in an American league box score. Fifteen years ago on that date, under the name of Sullivan, the now famous second baseman was sent into the Athletics lineup by Connie Mack in a game against the White Sox played in Chicago. Collins was not then out of college. He had a year yet to go at Columbia university and did not want to turn professional unless pretty sure he would make good. But he did want a trial and reported to Connie Mack.

His Sixth World's Series. The approach of another world's series also brings another line of history. Out in connection with Collins, the second baseman of the White Sox will this year appear in his sixth world's series.

Collins has made a young fortune out of the world's series alone. He has cut the melon in the big October classic three times, starting with the season of 1916, when he started as a member of Connie Mack's famous Athletics.

In 1917, 1918 and 1919 Collins converted in the world's series wearing an Athletic uniform, and when the White Sox annexed the American league pennant in 1919, he was again a member of the team.

Still a Youngster in Years. Collins is by no means an old man in spite of long service. On May 2 he was 32, having been born at Millerton, N. Y., in 1887. But he is showing no signs of falling. Over 154 or 149 games, as the case may be, he is a wonderful performer, day in and day out.
