Russians Making Slow Progress in Petrograd Drive South and Southwest of Capital.

LONDON, Oct. 22.—Krasnaya Gorka, a fortified city on the southern shore of the Gulf of Finland, about 30 miles west of Petrograd, has been taken by anti-Bolshevik troops, according to Helsinki dispatches.

DENIKIN CAPTURES 3,000 ENEMY TROOPS

LONDON, Oct. 22. (By the Associated Press.)—The Bolsheviks have been driven back in the Kamysk section, losing 3,000 men, who were taken prisoner, and many machine guns, according to Gen. Denikin's wireless communication. Extremely fierce fighting is reported in that district. Kamysk lies north of Tsaritsyn. The Bolsheviks are reported to be retreating in the direction of Petrograd, destroyed nearly 2,000,000 tons of newly cut grain.

SWISS WILL NOT SIGN NEUTRAL RUSSIAN NOTE

BERNE, Oct. 22. (By the Associated Press.)—The Swiss government has declined to join in the collective reply of other neutral states regarding the invitation of the allies to participate in the blockade of Soviet Russia. It is pointed out that Switzerland long ago had broken off relations with the Bolshevik government and that there existing Russian government and that there are no commercial or financial relations of any kind between the two nations. It is stated that the invitation, intended by the allies has been reached already as far as Switzerland is concerned and no change in Swiss policy is now needed.
