COMMISSION IS TO INVESTIGATE PACKERS' TRUST

Attacks of Senator Watson in Behalf of Big Five Are Not to Delay Work Cut Out for Probers, Is Announced.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Nov. 6.—The federal trade commission has informed the senate that the total cost of publishing statements as to Senator James B. Watson of Indiana and his alleged interest in the big meat packers was taken from the funds of the commission. The total cost was \$2.50. With the information handed to the senate, it is taken for granted that no effort will be made to pursue this line of attack on the commission.

The commission, however, will not hesitate in its investigation of the packers. The commission, according to Chairman Colver, is charged by law with seeing that an American business concern shall be assured the right in peace to pursue that happiness which accompanies a good conscience and a lively sense of equitable and fair dealing. It has sought to discharge that obligation faithfully and honestly, he says.

In doing so, the commission has run afoul of a group of great business concerns whose business theories and practices we have had to question," he says. "These are the five big Chicago meat packers. They have retaliated. They have spent millions of dollars in advertising.

Attack Commission.

"These men have charged the commission with conspiracy and what amounts to treason. The charge made by Senator Sherman of Illinois has been answered and proof has been challenged. Instead of proof we get new charges. Employees of the commission are charged with sedition and Bolshevism.

"I have challenged them to prove their charges. I challenge them again. I dare them to come forward with their proof.

"This is not new. Go to a public library and get the bound files of any newspaper covering May and June of 1908 and you will find these very charges, these very phrases—about socialism and anarchy (the typical Watson charges) and destruction of export trade—all uttered by the then president of the United States, Theodore Roosevelt. His fault was that he was urging the passage of a meat inspection law to keep unfit meat off the tables of the people. Roosevelt won, and on June 30, when the light reached its climax, Senator Henry Cabot Lodge arose in the United States senate and said:

"What has been the history of that group of men who run those packing establishments? It has been a history of utter defiance of law and of public opinion. But I say, and I say it in all seriousness, that those packers in Chicago have done more to advance socialism and anarchy and unrest and agitation than all the socialistic agitators who stand today between the oceans."

Watson Is Refuted.

In connection with this statement, Chairman Colver reviewed the activities of the trade commission relative to the assertions of Senator Watson's personal defender, Senator Penrose of Pennsylvania. Penrose, in defending Watson, insisted the commission had been the subject of general attack from almost everyone and had been attacked in almost every kind of profane language. Penrose's statement, if conceded to have been true, would have put the commission in a very poor light, and Colver's reply therefore could not have been other than a reply to both Watson and Penrose.

"The commission has had 1,457 complaints brought against business firms throughout the country, he said. Competitors of these firms contended they were being dealt with unfairly. After examination, 724 of these cases were dismissed; 339 are still in process of preliminary investigation, and the remaining 299 cases, the commission instituted formal proceedings. Of 298 complaints brought, only 25 were dismissed because of insufficient evidence. Except in these 298 cases, the contention of the government has not been passed upon as yet.

"Of the remaining 133 cases, the order of the commission to cease and desist was issued, and here comes what I believe to be one of the greatest examples of the inherent fairness of the American business man," said Colver. "For out of the 133 cases where the business concern, after trial and hearing, and after having brought home to it the consequences, refused to accept of its conduct upon competitors, 130 of the respondents have voluntarily agreed to accept the order to cease and stop the bad practice.

"Thus we find that the federal trade commission, seeking to administer a fair and just law and dealing with the fair and just people in a spirit of fairness and equity, finds a minimum of controversy and a maximum of accommodation."

GERMAN-AUSTRIA IS ABOLISHED AS NAME

VIENNA, Austria, Nov. 6. (By Associated Press.)—The national assembly today passed an act abolishing the name of "German-Austria" for the nation and substituting the title "Republic of Austria." The Pan-German party offered violent opposition to the change.

The government has ordered a national census to be taken in December.



CANADA'S WHEAT CROP IS 193,688,800 BUSHELS

OTTAWA, Oct. 31.—Canada's total yield of wheat for the year 1919 is now placed at 193,688,800 bushels, according to the latest bulletin issued by the Dominion bureau of statistics. Earlier reports had indicated that the wheat yield would be considerably lower, but favorable weather and late rains in many districts brought a marked improvement before harvesting began. Although 1919 was considered a dry year, many districts produced record crops. Manitoba, generally, had a good year, the biggest crop being harvested in the Brandon district, wheat averaging from 25 to 40, and oats running better than 60. In Saskatchewan the Regina district averaged 25 bushels. Around Husar, Alberta, wheat averaged from 20 to 40 bushels to the acre.
