ITALY BUYS ALL MACARONI STOCK FROM AMERICA

Ancient Land Which Grows in Proportion More Wheat to Acre Overflows With Olive This Harvest Year.

SIENNA, Italy, Nov. 14. (Special Correspondence of Itceprocal News Service.)—It will soon be time for the autumn planting of wheat and every acre of available land in the Italian peninsula is being planted to the grain. Italy, in proportion to its available land, is the country which produces the most wheat in the world, 111 quintals the square kilometer, where very little can grow the amount is not sufficient for the needs of the population. So she has always imported a certain amount of wheat, especially the hard wheat for its superior quality. This was used for making macaroni, a similar variety of which came from the United States, and another sort from the Argentine republic. As now the first three months of supply are out of the question, the imported grain must all come from the Americans. The amount raised in Italy during these years of warfare has been smaller than usual, so naturally the price of bread, at the present time, is very high, and it has been necessary to raise it slightly just now, because at the present rate of exchange, the government has been unable to buy at a price which is a dead loss and a heavy burden to carry. It therefore behooves Italy to secure wheat in her power to raise as much grain as she possibly can, and at once.

Good Grade of Wheat.

Rather a curious state of things prevailed in Sardinia and Sicily at one time during the war. These islands were able to produce a better grade of hard wheat than any other, and so they exchanged their grain with the continent, as they call the mainland (as the people of Nantucket do) for the kind of wheat which made good flour for bread. But the waters around the islands were full of mines, and submarines were always lurking near, so there were times when peaceable cargo boats dared not venture out. All the hard wheat had been sent over to the mainland, and the Sardinians and Sicilians were waiting for their new crops. They had some of the same trouble with their citrus fruits, which form such a large proportion among the exports from the islands. Owing to the dangers above mentioned and the great difficulties of land traffic, and the small amount of the fruit, the quantities of fruit went to waste, and except for the lemons, which were included in the army supplies, the rest was sent away.
