

VICKSBURG TO HAVE \$500,000 NEW MILL

VICKSBURG, Miss., Dec. 19 (Spl.)—Five hundred thousand dollars will be expended by what is now known as the largest plant of its kind in the United States, at Vicksburg, Miss. Houston Bros. mill known as the "big mill," is to have added a modern veneer plant, a box factory, a planing mill with a dry kiln, and a tie and timber mill. The whole department is to be extended to include the operating and handling of the total output of outside mills; and the retail department, now unable to meet local demands, will be enlarged and extended to include a full line of everything required for building. The company's timber holdings lie principally in the basin of the Yazoo river and are said to be as extensive as any in the South and to contain all the different varieties of hardwoods. The lands bordered and crossed by the V & M V. railroad, are to be cleared as fast as the timber is cut, and put in cultivation. The department of the territory is to be promoted.

BOLTON COLLEGE SUE

Maintain School Patrons Have No Right to File Petition for Removal.

Declaring that the intervening petitioners in the Bolton college case in which certain patrons of the school are seeking to have the trustees removed from office on a charge of inefficiency, have not the right to present the petition to the chancery court in the name of the state of Tennessee, Judge M. M. Noll and R. G. Gratz, attorneys for the trustees, filed a demurrer to the petition of removal. The demurrer was filed before Chancellor F. H. Hiebel, but that judge declined to hear same on the ground that he was not qualified to do so. The trustees, when approached by a committee of patrons of Bolton college some time ago to oust the trustees, declined to do so on the ground that the petitioners were not the proper parties to bring the charges and advised them to get the attorney-general of the state to take action. The trustees, in the demurrer, hold that the attorney-general is the proper party to bring the suit.

GARNSEY QUILTS FUEL CONTROL
